Prior Knowledge

In KS1, the children named and located the seven continents and 5 oceans. They learnt about life in Kampong Ayre and compared its landscape to our environment in Kings Nympton. They also studied Antarctica in History, concentrating on two famous explorers.

In KS2, the children have studied rainforests, climate zones and biomes, Poland, the world's countries, continents and oceans and volcanoes. This year, the children have completed a unit of work on settlement and migration.

Lesson 2: I can use maps, atlases, globes to locate countries and describe features studied in the context South America.
