SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

This week, Reception have been reading and working on The Gingerbread Man. They have been following instructions for decorating their own gingerbread men, making a story map, creating posters to persuade the characters to eat other types of biscuits (to save the gingerbread man) and they have started to think about what we do to celebrate Easter. In Maths, they have been investigating and learning about 3D shapes. They have compared them, made models with them, found real 3D shape objects in the classroom and used the faces to print with.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have continued their learning with Tell me A Dragon by Jackie Morris. They have been thinking about what dragons could be like. They have created their own dragons and collected some fantastic descriptive words for them. They even role played being a dragon! They have been learning about using different sentence starters in their writing. In Maths, Year 1 and 2 have started a unit of work on measurement, specifically length and height. Year 1 have been practically comparing lengths and heights as well as using non-standard units of measurement to measure objects. Year 2 have been measuring things using rulers and metre sticks.

Other lessons have included learning about Grace Darling, making their shadow puppets in DT and researching the question- How do plants grow in extreme habitats? They have also been learning how to throw (both underarm and overarm) in PE.

Don't forget we are going to Exmoor Zoo on Monday. Please ensure your child has their school uniform on with suitable shoes and a coat for our unpredictable weather, as well as a packed lunch and plenty to drink.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 2

This week, Year 3 and 4 have been looking at their investigation in Science and seeing how water is transported through plants. Our experiment did not work fully and as a class we discussed reasons why this could be and have adapted the experiment to see if these will make a difference to the results.

In history they have been thinking about what the Romans brought to Britain when they invaded and the children have discussed these and compared modern Britain with Roman time Britain, before completing their end of unit assessments.

In DT the children have been finalising their plans and resources lists for their projects and may be raiding the recycling bins this week to gather boxes and other materials. We hope to complete them next week! In Maths this week the children have been learning about parallel, perpendicular, horizontal and vertical lines.

Years 5 and 6 have been learning about fossils in Science this week and about what they can tell us about the animals, the children studied different fossils and discussed what they could learn from them, for example what they might eat to where they would live.

In DT the children created their own mechanism that could make a part move on their animal, the children worked in pairs to solve the problem and each group made a successful model.

In Maths, this week we have continued our learning about angles and the children have learnt about vertically opposite angles and angles in triangles. We have tried to get outside for our learning when possible braving the cold and wet, hopefully the rain disappears soon.

Today Year 5 and 6 and some Year 4 children have travelled to Winkleigh to take part in a netball tournament, the children have been very excited about this all week and we look forward to hearing how they got on and seeing some action shots. Thank you to Mrs Miali and Mrs Slade for taking them over and thankyou to Mrs Miali, Mr Davis and Mr Walter for organising, the children really appreciate it.

Next Tuesday 6 children will travel to Winkleigh to take part in a football tournament, we look forward to hearing about this next week.

Next Friday Year 3 and 4 have their first forest school, hopefully the sun will make an appearance on Friday.

Until...

CONTRACTOR OF THE PROPERTY OF	
at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
48 hours after their last episode	
they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
4 days after the rash first appeared	
5 days after the swelling started	
they've had their first treatment	
24 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
