#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1

This week, we went on our trip to Exmoor Zoo with Year 1 from Winkleigh. The weather was lovely and we all had a fantastic time! We saw lots of different animals and learnt about how they are classified, ready for our Science lessons next term. We also had the Easter Extravaganza in school on Thursday. Everyone really enjoyed this. Thank you to the Friends of Kings Nympton.

In the classroom, Reception have made gingerbread men for the whole class, learnt about the resurrection of Jesus, how we celebrate Easter and discussed the texts they have been learning about this term. In Maths, they have been investigating, describing and learning about non-linear patterns.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have completed their work on the book, *Tell Me A Dragon* by Jackie Morris. They have created a poster in the style of this book. They had to choose some images of dragons and write some descriptive sentences about each of them, using the skills they have learnt in this sequence. They created some lovely, lyrical sentences and are all very proud of their work. In Maths, Year 1 and 2 have completed the unit of work on length and height. Year 1 have learnt how to use a ruler to measure and draw lines correctly and have been practising how to measure objects too. Year 2 have been comparing and ordering lengths in centimetres and metres, as well as using the four operations to calculate lengths.

Other lessons have included learning about the RNLI, performing their shadow puppet shows and being creative with some Easter activities.

#### Class 2

A busy week in Class 2 this week.

In English we have concluded our teaching sequence on Leon and the space between. The children have planned their own magical place between and created their own story based on the story.

In Maths, Years 3 and 4 have been learning about shapes and have created their own 3D shapes and labelled faces edges and verticals. Years 5 and 6 have continued their learning on angles and have been investigating the interior angles of polygons and how they can calculate the different angles. This week we have finished our sequences and have completed their end of unit assessments demonstrating their learning from the sequences.

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
