SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

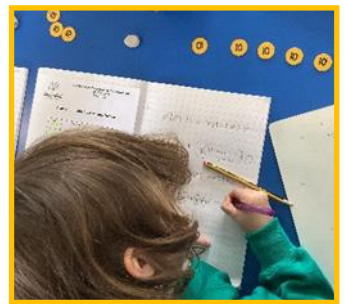


Class 1

Although we have had a shorter week in school, the children have all been working very hard. Reception have been discussing and thinking about trains this week. They have compared steam and electric trains, discussed cartoons and books about trains and written sentences about a train journey they would like to go on. Maths activities have involved the children comparing, naming and investigating 2D shapes.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have completed their work on our class text, *How to Grow Your Own Lettuce*, by writing their own introduction and instructions for doing something. Some examples of these ideas are making a sandwich, keeping healthy and cleaning our teeth! In Maths, Year 1 have started a unit of work on multiplication and division. They have been making and recognising equal groups, adding equal groups and counting in 10s. It would be great if you could support your child's learning at home by encouraging and helping them to count in 2s, 5s and 10s whenever possible. Year 2 have completed their work on temperature and finished this unit by learning about volume and capacity. They have been comparing capacity and measuring in millilitres and litres by reading and using different scales.

In other lessons, the children have been comparing the geographical features of Kampong Ayer and Kings Nympton, learning what animals and humans need to survive, sketching trees in the school grounds and thinking about forgiveness. We hope you all have a fantastic long coronation weekend and look forward to seeing you all again on Tuesday.

Class 2

Another busy but short week in Class2 this week.

In Science Years 5 and 6 have been learning about reflection and had to use mirrors and a light source to illuminate an object at the centre of a maze. The children investigated how light travels and what materials they could use to help them in their challenge. In Years 3 and 4 we have been learning about reflectors and the difference between a reflector and a light source. The children categorised a series of objects into the two categories and used their knowledge to help explain their reasoning.

Last week, Years 3 and 4 enjoyed their third forest school day, making puppets from elder and baking a cake on the fire. They particularly enjoyed tasting the cake. This week sees the last forest school for Years 3 and 4 and Doughnuts are on the menu! Thank you to Mrs Blacker for her hard work and all the adults that help us at forest school, I know that Years 5 and 6 are very excited for their forest school days!

On Wednesday this week Class 2 enjoyed their Roman day experience, the children were fully immersed within the experience as part of the Dumnonii tribe. The children learnt about life in Britain at that time and had to make the decision to either join the Roman rule or fight. The children enjoyed seeing artefacts and having the opportunity to hold and dress up as Romans. In the afternoon the children become Roman soldiers and learnt how to work as a unit, moving together as one. The children used their skills to warn of an attack the tribe of pre-school and Class 1.

Next week sees our Year 6 completing their Year 6 Sat's papers, we would like to invite them to come in for breakfast everyday next week before their Sat's from around 8.15.

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
