### THE LEARNING ZONE



SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1

This week, Reception have been learning the colours of the rainbow, when rainbows can appear and how rainbows can make us feel. They have been colour mixing and painting a big rainbow altogether, writing about what the colours of the rainbow remind them of and have listened to several different stories about rainbows. Can they retell any of these stories?

In Maths, they have been investigating the numbers 6, 7 and 8. They have been finding ways to make these numbers and using the mathematical phrases 'one more' and 'one less' to compare them.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have started a unit of work based on the book, *Mixed Up fairy Tales* by *Hilary Robinson*. They have been experimenting with sentence structure by using conjunctions and noun phrases to extend sentences. They have also been changing the tense of verbs and considering how this affects the story.

In Maths, Year 1 have been finishing their unit of work on addition and subtraction. They have been comparing calculations and creating fact families for numbers to twenty. Year 2 have been finishing their unit of work on multiplication and division. They have been learning and practising how to divide by 5 and 10. At this stage, knowing the 2, 5 and 10 times table is important in Year 2, so any practise you could provide at home would be very helpful.

In other lessons, the children have created under water food chains, made jellyfish aquariums, learnt about the main climates of the world, made their own trolls using recycled materials and learnt how to roll in different ways for gymnastics.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 2

This week Class 2 have continued their sequence in English. The children have been reading Harry Potter, in guided reading. All the children are enjoying reading Harry Potter and for a few of the children it's their first experience of a Harry Potter book. We have been learning about using apostrophes for possession and the children practiced their skills in numerous ways. The children were encouraged to take ownership of their learning and choose an activity to hone their skills.

In Maths Years 3 and 4 have been learning about fractions and have been finding fractions of amounts and have started to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. Years 5 and 6 have been learning about percentages and finding a percentage of an amount and finding a percentages as a fraction and a decimal.

In Science, Years 3 and 4 have continued their posters on deforestation and have been speaking about how it can impact the environment and animals. Years 5 and 6 learnt about arthropods and used their knowledge to find some around the school site.

In Geography, the children have been concluded their learning about natural resources and have learnt about conserving supplies of energy.

In PE the children have continued their sequence on Hockey and have been applying their new skills in a game situation.

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
