SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

### Class 1

We have had a great week in Class 1.

Nicola (Celebrate Cacao) came in to our class for the morning and taught us about how chocolate is made and how to make our own mini chocolate bars from cacao beans. The children thoroughly enjoyed working with Nicola for the morning and learnt a great deal. Thank you to Nicola for providing such a fun and educational workshop. We also had our first Sharing Assembly this week. The children worked really hard on this and all spoke with confidence and enthusiasm. Well done to you all and thank you everybody for coming into school to watch the assembly. Reception have been learning the Three Billy Goats Gruff this week. They have been labelling pictures from the story, drawing their own trolls and comparing the sizes of the goats. In Maths, they have been comparing and using the numbers nine and ten. They have been investigating ways they can split these numbers

In English, Years 1 and 2 have completed their work on Knights. They have been researching different jobs, planning what information they need and writing their own text for a particular job. In Maths, Year 1 and 2 have started a unit of work on 'Time'. Year 1 have been recapping the days of the week and the months of the year, as well as learning how to read and draw o'clock times. Year 2 have recapped o'clock and half past times, then learnt how to read and draw quarter past/to times and 5 minute intervals of time.

Other lessons have included learning about the life cycle of a bean plant, what Victorian children did at the seaside, Maundy Thursday and how to create animal hand shadow puppets.

Well done Class 1 and we hope you have a lovely weekend!

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 2

Another busy week in Class 2 this week.

In English the children have finished planning and writing their own legend following the pattern of 'How the Whale became'. The children have been working hard on adding detail to their writing and using different types of sentences in their writing. This week we have started our new book 'Leon and the space between', the children have been creating sentences about the first page including prepositions. In Maths, this week the children have finished their teaching sequences, Years 3 and 4 have completed their sequence on mass and capacity and started their new sequence on properties of shape, while Years 5 and 6 have finished their sequence on area, perimeter and volume and started their sequence on Geometry.

In Science, Years 3 and 4 have been learning about the life cycle of a plant and have created their own leaflet explaining the process of the life cycle. In Years 5 and 6 the children have been learning about animal adaptions and how certain animals have adapted to suit their environment. the children discussed what would happen if you moved an animal to a new environment as well as what would happen if their environment.

On Thursday Class 2, welcomed Nicola and learnt all about making chocolate and even got to taste and make their very own chocolate.

Last week children from Years 5 and 6 travelled to Winkleigh to compete in a tag rugby festival against other primary schools from the local area. The children enjoyed their afternoon and played with smiles on their faces all afternoon. I was impressed with the children who organised themselves throughout the afternoon. Well done Year 5 and 6 and thankyou to Winkleigh for hosting. Thank you to Mr Davis and Mr Walter who gave up their afternoon to organise and co-ordinate the day. Next week is NFER week and the children will not have spellings on Friday.

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
