SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

Reception have been using the book, '*Rosie's Hat*' by Julia Donaldson to write sentences using their phonic knowledge, retell the story, recognise rhyming words and even make windmills that can be blown in the wind.

In Maths, they have been investigating mass and capacity, using mathematical phrases such as heavier than, lighter than, empty, full, more than and less than. Can they describe the mass or capacity of things in the same way at home?

In English, Year 1 and 2 have completed their unit of work on traditional tales. They have done this by writing their own version of a tale. We have had hairy dogs meeting a troll, three little wolves being chased by a hunter and a runaway chip man being eaten by a little girl! The children have worked really hard on their writing and are very proud of themselves. Well done to you all!

In Maths, Year 1 have been concentrating on subtracting two numbers that pass the number ten. They have been using tens frames, part-whole models and bar models to practise doing this. Year 2 have been concentrating on dividing a number. They have done this by investigating sharing and grouping a number to make equal groups.

In other lessons, the children have created their own journey lines around the world, classified things as living, dead or never alive, listened to and sung a 'blues' song and discussed how to be safe around medicines.

Class 2

We have had a busy week in Class 2 this week!

In English, we have started our new sequence, Harry Potter, the children have been learning about building a description using different word types. In Years 3 and 4, the children have been learning about prepositions and identifying them in sentences.

In Maths, Years 3 and 4 have been investigating equivalent fractions using Cuisenaire rods. The children have been using bar models to show equivalent fractions. In Years 5 and 6 we have been multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by integers. The children have enjoyed challenging themselves to complete and set challenges for others.

In PE, the children have continued their sequence on Hockey, the children have enjoyed learning skills and applying them to game situations.

On Thursday, Jago and Romeo travelled to Winkleigh to join in the The Woodland Federation football team. They got into the plate competition, where they made it into the semi-finals. All the children had a great day and played some great football. Thank you to Mr Davis for organising and taking the children.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
