#### Class 1—Mrs Godly

We have been busy in class this week. Reception have been outside in the school grounds collecting signs of autumn and using these to help them compare things that are the same or different about them. They have also been reading and talking about *The Family Book* by *Todd Parr*. This book looks at all the different types of families there are and the children have enjoyed talking about all the people in their families.

In English, Years 1 and 2 have been working hard on writing their own version of *Oi Frog!*. They planned their characters and created their own rhyming couplets to use in their stories.

For our Maths lessons, Year 1 have been learning about ordinal numbers and using a number line to help with ordering numbers and comparing them.

Year 2 have started a unit of work on addition and subtraction by finding fact families, comparing number sentences and using related facts to help with their calculating. In other lessons, we have been learning about the different weather and climates other places in the world have, testing to see if 'all hard materials cannot absorb water', making a Mezuzah and drawing, then improving a sketch of a tiger.

We have had our last Forest School day this week and we would like to thank Mrs Blacker for running this and Mrs Lintin for helping us all. The children have loved these days and we are all looking forward to the summer term when we will be going again!

#### Class 2—Mr Saltearn

Another busy week in class 2! In English this week the children have been preparing their own story using their Mechanimal that they designed last week. The children have been planning and choosing how they want to present their story. The children could choose between a comic strip, newspaper or a traditional story, we have also been working hard on proof reading our work and checking for errors that we can correct.

In Maths, this week Year 3 and 4 have finished their sequence on place value and have started their new sequence of addition and subtraction.

In Year 5 and 6 we have been tackling multi step problems and using the term RUCSAC to support us when answering these.


In Science, Year 3 and 4 have been learning about magnets and the terms attract and repel, we created a fact sheet of theses and drew an image to support the definitions.

In Year 5 and 6 we have been learning about levers and the children created their own seesaw and started to experiment what may happen if we moved the fulcrum and adjusted the load and effort.

In PE, the children have finished their sequence of football and on Monday will start the inter school sports competition, continuing from last year.


Next week we have our first forest school with Mrs Blacker, which we are looking forward to! Please give your consent on the Gateway if you haven't already. Thanks.

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
