

Falling gently from up high.



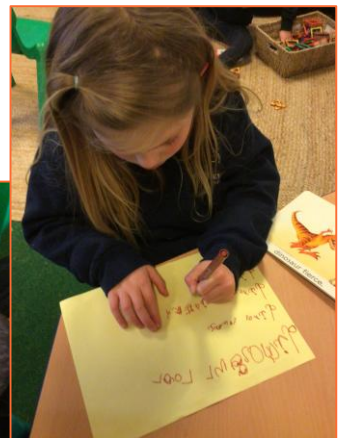
Class news

Year 1 – Mrs Roberts

We were all excited to return after the Christmas break and share our holiday adventures!

Despite the icy and wet weather, we've had a busy and productive first week back.

We are now learning to count on from 10 in Maths for our next sequence on place value within 20. The children enjoyed recapping number bonds to 10 and have begun counting on from 10 up to 20.

Our Curious Quests continues in English! The children have loved choosing a character to go on these adventures as we discover new books this term. They created and described their characters using fantastic vocabulary such as *resilient*, *mighty*, *swift*, and *fierce*.

In RE we began our sequence on Sacred Places and will be exploring different sacred places for different believers.

In Science our new topic is Animals, including humans. We discussed different groups of animals, including mammals, fish, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. The children are excited to explore each group further as the term progresses.

In Geography we travelled to Sri Lanka! We compared similarities and differences between the UK and Sri Lanka and are looking forward to learning more about this beautiful island country.

In PE, we have started our learning sequence on Gymnastics. The children have been learning to make different shapes using their bodies and are enjoying exploring movement and balance.

Just a gentle reminder for children to bring their home reader and Polar bear books in to school everyday.

Year 2 – Mrs Keast

Year Two have settled back into routine this week and have shown a positive attitude to learning across the curriculum.

In English, we have begun a new non-fiction unit based on the text Look Inside Space. The children have been fascinated by the facts they have discovered so far and have enjoyed exploring the text to identify key information. We have also been learning to define and understand new vocabulary linked to our space topic.

In Maths, we have completed our learning sequence on shape and are now moving on to multiplication and division. The children are starting this sequence by organising objects into equal groups and developing a secure understanding of what this means in practical ways.

Guided reading has continued as part of our daily timetable. Please can children remember to bring their polar bear reading records into school every day so that reading can be recorded and monitored.

In Art, we learned about the artist Wassily Kandinsky and created our own versions of his concentric circle artwork. In Science, we used our five senses to explore the outdoor area and discussed how our senses often work together. In PE, we began our hockey unit, learning how to hold the stick correctly and move the ball carefully around the playground.

Year 3 – Mrs Bourner

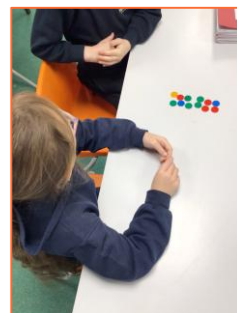
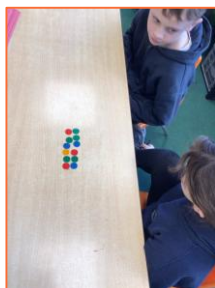

We have had a busy start to 2026 and the children have settled back into the routines well despite the weather disruptions! Our first English sequence this term is based around Grimms Fairytales, and the children have enjoyed listening to and reading a selection of both familiar and unfamiliar tales. They have thought about the elements of a fairytale and have enjoyed learning the meanings of new words associated with these traditional tales. It was lovely to see them really enjoying their tag rugby lesson earlier in the week working well together with partners to learn new skills. They also worked particularly well in Art where we were looking at the works of artist Vincent Van Gogh and finding out about his life. In R.E, the children enjoyed learning the new vocabulary associated with our topic on Islam. What a great first week back we have had. I hope you all stay warm and dry over the weekend!



Year 4 – Mr Walter

After a disrupted start to the term, it has been wonderful to welcome everyone back following the festive break. Year 4 have settled quickly and shown great enthusiasm for our new learning. In English, we have begun exploring Varjak Paw, focusing on character emotion and the Paw family tree, detailing the relationships between various members.

In Maths, we have been identifying factor pairs and using different strategies to spot them efficiently. Across the wider curriculum, we have been introduced to new sequences of learning, including natural resources, electricity, the Holy Trinity and internet safety. These topics will continue to develop over the coming weeks as we build key vocabulary and deepen understanding further. Next week, we are looking forward to joining Year 3 for an Intrasport football event in school you are more than welcome to spectate from 1:30pm. Have a great weekend!

Year 5 – Mr Saltearn

It has been great to welcome back Year 5 after the Christmas break for the Spring term. This week we have been starting our foundation subject sequences and in Art this week, we started to look at our artist William Morris learning about his work before looking to replicate a piece of his art work using symmetry and repetitive patterns.

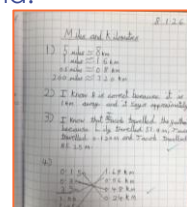
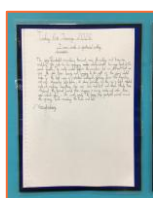
In Geography this week we have been discussing the vocabulary that we will be using this term and the water cycle. We have been learning about the water cycle and what happens using music and songs to help us remember the stages of the water cycle.

In Maths, this week we have continued with our multiplication and have been multiplying a 4 digit number by a 2 digit number. We have just began to look at division and using short division to help us solve different problems. Have a great weekend Year 5.



Year 6 – Miss McLean

Year 6 have come back to school with a great attitude towards their learning and have been getting stuck into their new sequences in all subjects. In guided reading, we have started looking at the book Skellig and using this to practice answering retrieval, inference and vocabulary questions. The children have been asking some insightful questions about the characters and making their own predictions. In English, we have started reading A Wizard of Earthsea. We began the sequence with some character and setting description and will develop this descriptive writing further next week when reminding ourselves about relative clauses and different tenses. We have been looking at converting units of measurement and solving problems involving calculating using a range of units. Next week we will be learning about the place value of decimal numbers including multiplying and dividing them by 10, 100 and 1,000. We have spent some time looking at all of the new vocabulary for this half term's sequences as well as discussing which of our concepts they fit into. The children enjoyed starting our science sequence by looking outside for examples of living and non-living things and used key vocabulary to explain how they knew. Have a wonderful weekend!
