


Climates and continents

Prior Knowledge

Year 1: In Year 1, you learnt about the United Kingdom and the four countries. We will use this knowledge to compare areas of the world with Winkleigh and the United Kingdom.

Where next? Future learning

In Year 3, you will look in more depth at the United Kingdom, considering the difference between counties, cities, countries and continents. You will also learn more about the role of tectonic plates in natural disasters.

Throughout Years 4, 5 and 6, you will use the locational knowledge that you develop in this sequence. You will make comparisons and links within your learning.
