

Pre-school – Mrs Stapley

Dear Families,

We have had a ROAR-some time in the preschool as we continued exploring the exciting world of dinosaurs, practised our ball and bean bag skills, and created beautiful marble paintings!

Throughout this half term our classroom has been full of curiosity and imagination for our dinosaur topic.

Our topic highlights:

- Learning the names of different dinosaurs like Tyrannosaurus Rex, Triceratops, and Stegosaurus
 - Talking about herbivores and carnivores
 - Exploring the idea of fossils and how scientists learn about dinosaurs
- Engaging in imaginative dinosaur play and movement activities (stomping, stretching, roaring!)

Through these experiences, we developed our vocabulary, practised listening skills, and encouraged creative storytelling.

Class 1 – Mrs Betts

In our English sequence, the children have been learning to write letters. They each chose a nursery rhyme character and thought about what their problem could be. They then wrote a letter to Mother Goose asking for some advice. They also had a go at writing a response which included some humorous advice. In maths, KS1 began their new unit on multiplication and division. They began by counting in 2, 5, 10's and 3's. Then, they looked at recognising equal and unequal groups, and investigated finding equal groups.

In Drawing Club, reception have finished off drawing and coding for Batfink and the Mad Scientist. This week, the scientist wanted to invent a machine that would do a good deed, so the children had a go at drawing their good deed machines. In maths, reception have been learning about length and height. They have been using the vocabulary tall, short, taller and shorter, as well as, long, short, longer and shorter. The children have made long and short worms and had a go at drawing around themselves to see how tall they are. They are beginning to compare their heights using shortest and tallest.

In our foundation subjects, the children have been finishing off their final tasks and using their new knowledge and work to complete them. The children's artwork is now on display in the church and it looks amazing! Some of the artwork was carried out with the artist EmmyLou at Winkleigh and the other pieces were created in class with Mrs Blacker. The children should be super proud of their hard work and their final pieces. I know that we are!

The classroom has been buzzing during the morning English lessons, collating a wide range of descriptive words and creating expanded noun phrases, inspired by images related to the text. They've worked hard on their planning and have transferred their ideas beautifully into their books for their final write.

When we return after half term the class will be starting a new sequence on fractions for maths. The children erupted in a little cheer and are genuinely excited to start working on fractions. We will also be switching from history to geography and art to technology after half term.

Swimming continues to be a huge success and the class are thoroughly enjoying their time at the pool, as am I! Swimming will continue on Wednesdays after half term for a few weeks.

The work produced in art this half term is being displayed at the church, along with the pictures they created with Emmy Lou. I hope that you get a chance to visit over half term to see the amazing pieces they have created – the children have worked very hard on their self-portraits and are very proud of the work they have produced.

I hope you all have a fantastic half term together and look forward to seeing everyone back and rested for the second half of the spring term.

Ensure software is updated and upgraded to latest versions as soon as they are made available
