## Class 2 - Newsletter Summer Term 2026



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back Class 2. I hope you all enjoyed the Easter break and are looking forward to the summer term!

The daily routine for the children is much the same as last term. Children will arrive at the school playground between 8.45am – 8:55am to ensure learning can begin at 9.00am. Lateness can be disruptive for the class and the children who are late. All children need to have a named water bottle and packed lunch with them, their school book bag with their reading record and books inside and a coat. Children are welcome to bring in a piece of fruit from home for a break-time snack. Lunches can be booked up to 8am on the morning of each day. Children will be collected from the school playground at 3:30pm **Please ensure that any changes are communicated to us if your child is being collected by someone different.**

Our PE days for this half term will be **Tuesday** and **Wednesday**. The children may continue to attend school in their PE kit on these days. PE kit consists of black tracksuit bottoms/shorts, white t-shirt and navy PE hoodie. The children may wear black trainers every day as we will regularly make use of our outdoor space. Once the children arrive in class, they will store their belongings before beginning their morning task. This will be followed each day by guided reading, English, spelling and maths sessions before lunch. The rest of the curriculum will take place in the afternoon. This involves History, PSHE, Science, PE, Music, Art, Spanish and Computing. Subject information pages can be found on the Class 2 page of our website. Children should be wearing sun screen/sun hats during any warm weather and have a secure, filled bottle of water. The children should carry their belongings in a book bag.

At the start and end of the day, please ensure that you supervise children carefully as we have narrow lanes and cars are arriving and departing. Please use the main playground only. Children should not be playing on the matted area equipment or top playground.

The children will continue to choose their own reading book from our class book corner and they will also be sent home with a teacher choice text with the aim of broadening the genres that they are reading. Please log any reading they are doing at home in their reading records, which must come to school every day. Our class spellings will be sent home each half term and a weekly spelling check will take place on a Friday. We will also continue our weekly Around the World check on a Friday. Additionally, Times Table Rockstars (TTRS), Letter-join and Rollama will be accessed in school and can be used at home to improve multiplication facts and handwriting legibility. Reading regularly at home is of paramount importance as this will have the most impact on your child's progress across the curriculum.

We appreciate your continuing support with fundraising as this enables us to significantly reduce the cost of trips and visits, which are important for bringing learning to life for children. There will be opportunities to interact with your child's learning and sporting achievements across the term. During this term, we will be having a visit from Tiverton museum to support our learning in history, as well as a whole school trip to the Honey Farm in South Molton and the residential in Bristol for Year 4. More details will follow in a separate letter closer to the trips.

Safeguarding is of paramount importance.
