#### Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley


This week we have been discussing our families and our homes. This has included drawing our families and creating collages of our homes.

#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls Class this week the children have been very excited to begin learning their phonic sounds. They have been searching for graphemes in the sandpit, writing them on chalkboards and in coloured sand, and matching objects to the graphemes based on their initial sounds. So far, they have learnt the sounds: s,a,t,p. *I wonder if you can spot any of these on road signs or in books this weekend Owls?* 

In maths, we have continued thinking about matching, and the children have looked at making matching sets, laying the table with matching crockery and cutlery and filling lunch boxes with matching foods! *I wonder if you can lay the table at home with matching knives, forks and spoons Owls?* 

On Wednesday we made the most of the lovely weather by picking apples from the orchard, peeling and chopping them to make (and of course eat) a delicious apple crumble. Lots of children even had second helpings they enjoyed it so much!

Our PSED work this week has focused on special toys. The children enjoyed listening to the story '*Dogger*' and it was lovely to hear all about the children's special toys on Thursday. They enjoyed showing them to their peers and talked about them with such confidence.

#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 1— Mrs Keast

This week we began Drawing Club! We began with 'The Everywhere Bear' by Julia Donaldson and Rebecca Cobb. We picked out some great vocabulary and created our own actions for words including 'plummet' 'whooshed' 'located' and 'cheerfully'. Then we thought about what cuddly toy we would choose to write about for our own version. The children have used their imaginations this week and we are working on our basic sentence construction and punctuation. Remembering to check we used a capital letter at the start and a full stop to end our sentence.



In Maths, we are continuing with place value within ten. We worked with ten frames this week, using them with counters to represent a number of objects. We played some fun games with our learning partners, matching images of objects with the numeral and a ten frame image. We are good at subsidising numbers – recognising the amount without the need to count the number.



This week in Art, we have been looking closely at objects from nature. We used pencils to create some drawings of shells, leaves, conkers and pine cones. This links to our learning about Andy Goldsworthy and his use of nature. Next week we look forward to our trip to Rosemoor on Thursday where we will have the opportunity to create some natural art of our own.



#### Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have enjoyed another brilliant week. They have been working hard in English to understand what sentences need, including subjects and verbs. We have been busy identifying them within sentences. We have also learnt about the four sentence types.

#### I wonder if you can explain them at home?

Maths has seen us working on drawing and labelling number lines. I have been so impressed with the presentation and quality of learning in books this week!

During science, we considered the difference between living, dead and never alive; coming up with and labelling examples of each.

Meanwhile, geography has involved learning about the five oceans and drawing conclusions about them based on their position on Earth.

Keep up all the fantastic reading at home, well done Year 2, a great week!

#### Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

What a busy week year 3s have had! We began a new teaching sequence based on the story 'Lord of the Forest'. The children have been producing some excellent writing. We are working on extending our writing in quality and quantity.

In maths we have continued to use manipulatives to develop further our understanding of place value. Music proved very interesting as we played the glockenspiels.

In science, we conducted the investigation we planned last week. We used rock and brick samples to see which were permeable and which weren't.

In geography we used fondant icing to make the Earth, beginning with the core in red and working out to the land and sea in green and blue. Let's hope they made it home for you to share your child's excitement when cutting it open!

Monitoring reading is still being tweaked. As children read at different paces there is no set day to exchange a book, it gets changed when it is finished. The children can do this independently using our book corner.

Lastly, the children are working hard and are often really hungry by break time. In KS2 we don't provide a healthy snack so please send your child in with a piece of fruit.









#### Year 4—Mr Walter

This week, Year 4 have been working hard to link our learning of rainforests with the story of The Great Kapok Tree. We started by writing our predictions of what would happen to the tree and characters within the story before explaining the meanings of a dilemma and resolution. Finally, we focussed on developing prepositional phrases in our writing.

In maths, we have continued our learning of place value. Finding less and more using our knowledge of the powers of 10 and investigating Roman numerals.

Elsewhere, in PE we have enjoyed our ultimate frisbee and football lessons to develop our skills. In RE, we discussed the different beliefs and symbols of Hindu gods and goddesses.

While in art, we continued to develop our sewing skills.

#### Year 5— Mr Saltearn

This week, Year 5 had their trip to Ultimate Adventure and we were really impressed with the resilience and determination that they showed throughout the day, conquering fears and challenging themselves during the assault course and high ropes. It was fantastic to see them all working as a team on the assault course, helping each other around difficult parts of the course.

In Maths, we have been working on our reasoning skills and explaining why an answer is wrong and showing the corrections using sentence stems.

In Science, the children constructed their own pyramid structure and had a magnet hanging from the point, we then tested different objects to see if they were magnetic. We then used the objects to try and move the magnet around the pyramid.

We have been focusing on our new book 'Great Adventures', The incredible journeys undertaken by twenty of the most heroic and impressive adventurers who ever lived and we have started to investigate what type and style of book it is.

#### Year 6—Miss McLean

It's been a fantastic week in Year Six, made even better by our joint trip with Year Five to Ultimate Adventure. The children all had a great day taking part in the high ropes and the water assault course. Everyone participated in all activities and thoroughly enjoyed the day!

In English this week, we finished a short sequence based on an adaptation of an opera by Handle, 'Aiden'. The children re-enacted a scene from the opera and thought about whether it was comedy or tragedy. We have just started our next sequence based around the story 'Beowulf' by making some predictions and discussing our likes and dislikes.

In maths, we have started our second sequence for the year, the four operations. The children used their resilience when working through some tricky problems this week involving a range of all four operations. Next week, we will be looking at the meaning of some key vocabulary such as factors and common multiples.

On Monday in science, we discussed how light travels and conducted an experiment to prove that it moves in straight lines only.

Finally, in art today, we continued our textiles collage sequence by practicing stitching skills and recalling the learning that we did in Year Four in preparation to begin our fabric collages next week.

It was lovely to see some families in school today for the grandparent's lunch, we hope you enjoyed it!






















### **Wraparound Care**

Flexible before and after school care available Monday to Friday each week during term time, with nutritious breakfasts and healthy snacks provided as well as appropriately supervised fun activities and games. Everybody is welcome, from Nursery to Year 6 with a range of different activities to suit the different age groups.

#### **Early Birds**

Early Birds Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am to 9.00am everyday. You may book as many days as you require. There are two options to choose, either with breakfast for £5.30 per session, or without breakfast for £4.30 per session.







#### **All Sorts**

All Sorts After School Club runs from 3.30pm to 5.30pm every day. You may book regular or ad-hoc sessions, whichever suits your requirements. You may book sessions for one hour for £5.30 (3.30pm - 4.30pm or 4.30pm - 5.00pm / 4.30pm - 5.30pm when booked in conjunction with an Enrichment Club), two hours for £10.60 (3.30pm-5.30pm).

#### **Reporting Absences**

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

#### Are you entitled?

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
