Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year 1 really enjoyed the sunny weather this week!

In Maths, we continued our learning about place value within 100. The children practiced partitioning numbers into tens and ones, worked out missing numbers on number lines, and even had a go at playing "One More, One Less" Bingo.

In English, we began our independent writing based on *Mrs. Armitage and the Big Wave*. The children have been working really hard to write their own stories using a cumulative structure, building on ideas as the story progresses.

Our History topic—*Holidays in the Past*—also continued this week. We discussed how the Victorians might have travelled to the seaside, why they went, and how the invention of the passenger train changed society. The children were fascinated by how this invention made holidays more accessible to many people in Victorian times.

We were also very excited to be invited to a Key Stage 1 multi-skills sporting event organised by Hatherleigh Primary School. Thirty children took part in a range of activities and games. It was a hot, sunny day, and we ended the event by cooling off in the shade with a much-needed ice lolly.



Year 2—Mr Slocombe

I cannot believe that another week has flown by! Year 2 have been busy learning all about statistics in maths this week. We have thought about reading and drawing pictograms with a 1:1 scale and 1:2, 1:5, 1:10 scales. We have just begun our new position and direction sequence today, thinking about the language of position.

English has seen us complete our own versions of the *Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch*. We then began our new learning around the text of *How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth*. We have considered the importance of the clarity of instructions to ensure that they convey specific information.

In History, we learnt more about rationing during the 40s and 50s and the impact that this had on farming and shopping. We had a fantastic time in PE, working alongside the Year 6s to complete some of our field events for Sports Day.

Year 3- Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

In English we continued our Paperbag Prince work, this week focussing on diary writing. The children learnt how to identify key features and then planned and wrote their own diary entry based on events from the book.

In Maths we continued our study of shape. We began by learning how to identify horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines. We drew and classified polygons and created 3D shapes from nets and construction materials.

In Science we continued our study of light by investigating the properties of mirrors. Are they light sources or reflectors?

In RE we learned why forgiveness is important. Computing saw us creating mazes for our sprites to navigate, using Scratch programming language.











Year 4-Mr Walter

Earlier this week, we finished our sequence to write our very own quest story. There were some fantastic adventures written with a variety of mythical creatures and obstacles to overcome. We have moved on to our *Outdoor Wonderland* sequence, focussing on activities that can be done outside using instructions.

In maths, we have extended our understanding of triangles, quadrilaterals and polygons. We have introduced how to identify if a shape is regular or irregular. **How many polygons can you identify at home?** This sequence will conclude next week before we move onto statistics.

On Thursday afternoon, we enjoyed the opportunity to join with Year 3 and take part in our final intrasport tournament of the academic year. We were able to develop our understanding of the rules in rounders and develop the tactics to play the game with fantastic batting and fielding skills. Something we will look to continue on Monday when we go to QE (Sandford) for cricket. Please could I stress the importance that all children have a hat in school everyday and a drinks bottle.

This week, in history we have created our own Anglo-Saxon village, identifying the key parts. In science, we discussed the different names of our teeth both as a child and an adult. Finally, in Spanish we applied our previous learning of colours to link with items of clothing.



- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
