



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to Year Five. What a fantastic time we had at Skern before the Easter holidays! It was lovely to see the children embracing so many new challenges!

The daily routine for the children is much the same as last term. Children will arrive through the gates from 8.45am. The gates shut promptly at 8.55am to ensure learning can begin at 9.00am. Lateness can be disruptive for the class and the children who are late.

Please ensure that children all have a named water bottle with them and their school book bag with their reading record and message book inside. Children are welcome to bring in a piece of fruit from home as a snack. Lunches can be booked up to 8am on the morning of each day. Please ensure that any changes are communicated to us if your child is being collected by someone different or if they are not travelling home on the school bus.

Our PE days for this half term will be **Monday** and **Wednesday**. The children may continue to attend school in their PE kit on these days, as well as if they have a sports after school club. PE kit consists of black tracksuit bottoms/shorts, white t-shirt and navy PE hoodie. The children may wear black trainers every day as we will regularly make use of our running track. Once the children arrive in class, they will store their belongings before beginning their morning task. This will be followed each day by guided reading, maths, spelling and English sessions before lunch. The rest of the curriculum will take place in the afternoon. This involves History, Geography, PSHE, Science, PE, Music, Art, Design & Technology and Computing. Subject information pages can be found on the Year 5 page of our website. Children should be wearing sun screen/sun hats during any warm weather. The children should carry their belongings in a **book bag**. We do not have the space for rucksacks in our cloakrooms and as such, children using them will be required to store them outside.

At the start and end of the day, please ensure that you use the pavement and supervise children carefully as we have busses arriving and departing. Children should not be playing on the grass bank or in the staff car parking area.

The children will continue to choose their own reading book from our class library and they will also be sent home with a teacher choice text with the aim of broadening the genres that they are reading. Please can any existing school books be returned as we cannot give a new reading book unless the previous one has been brought back. Our class spellings will be sent home each half term and a weekly spelling check will take place on a Friday. We will also continue our weekly around the world challenge, helping to ensure the children know key timestable facts. Reading regularly at home is of paramount importance as this will have the most impact on your child's progress across the curriculum.

During this term, we will be visiting We The Curious in Bristol. This trip will link to our learning in Science and inspire awe and wonder in the study of science. More details will follow in a separate letter closer to the time.

We are pleased to continue to be able to offer wraparound care. Our Early Birds club runs from 07.45-08.45 offering the option of breakfast. Our All Sorts club runs from 15.30-18.00. Both of these can be booked via the gateway and offer a variety of activities through the week to engage all children.

Safeguarding is of paramount importance. Our designated safeguarding lead is Mrs V Fenemore and deputies are Mr W Slocombe and Mrs D Rowcliffe. In the event that you have any concerns, please contact them through admin@winkleigh.devon.sch.uk Nationally, there has been an increase in children accessing the internet independently through a range of device, such as 'phones, gaming devices and tablets, it is possible to view very inappropriate content.

We promote key mental health values such as kindness; resilience and open communication; helping children to name and understand their feelings. Staff are trained to identify early signs of emotional difficulty, including changes in behaviour or engagement.
