In Maths, we have been doubling numbers. We had great fun outside in the garden area, hunting for Numicon pieces and recording the doubles as an addition number sentence.

In Geography we learned about Wales and tried some home-made Welsh Cakes that Mrs Roberts had baked. We talked about the national symbols that represent Wales, such as leeks, daffodils and dragons.

We had a great time on Thursday afternoon, celebrating VE Day. We enjoyed the afternoon tea party food and sitting outside with everyone in the school.

Year 3— Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

It's been another short week, but Year 3 have continued to work hard!

In **Maths**, they've been learning to tell the time accurately on both digital and analogue clocks.

In **English**, the children have been researching weird and wonderful plants and will be presenting their findings in the style of *The Big Book of Blooms*.

PE has seen the children developing their athletic skills, particularly through practicing with shot puts.

In **Science**, things have been especially exciting! The class has been investigating plant growth by experimenting with restricted water and light to discover what plants need to survive. They've also explored how water travels through a plant's stem using coloured water to watch white carnations change colour—a fascinating visual experiment!











Year 4—Mr Walter

It was lovely to mark the 80th anniversary of VE day yesterday in Year 4, with a sea of red, white and blue to enjoy our street party in the afternoon. Thank you also to everyone who came in this morning to look at some of our learning.

In English, we have been working on creating our own myth by focussing on the key ingredients a myth should include. We developed our own shared write before planning and writing our own examples. Some including mythical objects, magical creatures and evil siblings.

Maths this week, has seen us start part two of our decimal sequence. We have been exploring ways to make a whole using both tenths and hundredths whilst using dice to create our own decimal number and exploring how adding them together would break the whole.

Our focus in PSHE this week has been to understand the 7'rs associated with protecting the environment. *I wonder if you could think of any of these at home? Refuse, reduce, re-use, rot, recycle, repair and re-think.*

A great week in Year 5. In English, we have continued with our book '*Tuesday*' and we have started to draft our newspaper report of the sequel to '*Tuesday*'. We have been drafting and editing our writing this week before starting to write our finished newspapers on Thursday.

In Maths, we have started our new sequence on translation and have been busy plotting coordinates on axis and using what we know to solve problems involving coordinates.

In Geography, the children have been working in groups to design a sustainable house, including different features. The children had to explain their choices to the class as a group and then we voted to see which group we thought and designed the most sustainable house.

In Science, we have been talking about how we get night and day and the children created a short video to explain why we get night and day using themselves to be the Earth and the Sun.

It was fantastic to see all the children in red, white and blue to celebrate VE day yesterday!

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year 6 have continued to work hard in maths and English this week when recapping leaning in preparation for next week. They have shown some brilliant team work skills when completing group learning tasks such as scavenger hunts and team games.

In science, the children learnt about the heart. We discussed what its function is and how the structure of it helps it to do this job. The children looked at some 3D models before labelling a diagram of the heart with all the key vocabulary.

In geography, we looked at time zones and the children were challenged to use a time zone map to work solve some challenging questions relating to this.

The children continued their learning about Humanism by discussing the core values of Humanism and thought about the meaning behind the happy human symbol that represents the beliefs of Humanists.

Finally, it was lovely to celebrate VE day as a whole school and also wonderful to see parents/carers in school for our open morning today.

We look forward to welcoming the children in for breakfast next week from 8:15am.

To report your child absent please do so by telephoning the school and choosing Option 1 to leave a message on the absence line. You can also report an absence through the Gateway app.





Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Head lice	Tonsillitis	
Threadworms	Slapped cheek

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
