A huge thank you for providing costumes and helping to make our performances such a magical experience.

Year 2 – Mrs Keast

In Maths we have been learning about 3D shapes and the children have discussed the features of each shape – how many vertices, edges and sides they have.

Our new English sequence of learning is The Jolly Christmas Postman and the children are all very excited to go and see the theatre performance next week. This week they have been writing a diary entry from The Postman's perspective and writing about their favourite part of the story.

Next week we look forward to some enjoyable festive events and activities including Christmas games and our theatre trip on Tuesday afternoon.

Year 4 - Mr Walter

It has been another busy and exciting week in Year 4 as we head towards the end of term. In English, the children created their own conversations between characters, exploring how sentence length can be used for effect in narrative writing. In Maths, we completed our unit on area by comparing the areas of different rectilinear shapes. In History, we compared the Mayan number system with our own and discussed how differently numbers were represented. In Spanish, the children enjoyed learning songs linked to Christmas and birthdays.

A huge thank you to the kitchen team for our delicious Christmas dinner on Wednesday. Whilst on Thursday, it was fantastic to watch the Key Stage 1 production.

On Friday, we practised our readings and songs in the church in preparation for next week. We look forward to sharing these with you soon.

Year 5 – Mr Saltearn

In Year 5 this week, we have been completing our writing on Kensuke's Kingdom and have been creating our own alternative chapter 4 and ending to the book focusing on the key punctuation we have been learning about through the book. The children have enjoyed creating their own chapter to the book and showcasing their skills. In Maths, we have finished our sequence on fractions and have been practicing multiplying two 2-digit numbers together using both the area model and short multiplication. In Science this week, we have been learning about how we can separate mixtures and explaining how we could separate salt from water using evaporation. In History this week, we have been identifying the differences between school life in Victorian times compared to know and how leisure times have changed. On Wednesday, KS2 had their Christmas meal it was fantastic to see the children enjoying the Christmas spirit. Have a fantastic weekend Year 5!







Year 6 - Miss McLean

This year's Christmas activities are now in full swing! Year 6 enjoyed eating their Christmas dinner in the hall with the rest of KS2 on Wednesday, watching the KS1 Christmas performance on Thursday morning and rehearsing for the carol service this morning.

In maths this week, we have finished our learning on fractions by looking at how to find a fraction of a missing amount. We have also spent some time revising the four operations including looking at long division with and without remainders.

In English, the children have been focusing on identifying the differences between formal and informal language and styles of writing. They looked at some examples from My Secret War Diary and acknowledged the differences between diary entries, newspaper articles, letters to family members and postcards.

We are now coming towards the end of our sequences in the foundation subjects, the children have enjoyed conducting an experiment in science linked to voltage. Next week will be another busy one with plenty Christmas activities, starting with the Christmas games day on Monday. We look forward to welcoming you to the carol service on Wednesday afternoon! Remember-Set up devices!

With Christmas almost upon us, Scomis would like to take this opportunity to remind you of some important safety points to consider if your child is likely to receive a:

- SMART device (TV, Speaker)
- new mobile phone
- games console
- tablet PC

Check:

- the device is working correctly
- the device is fully charged
- the parental controls
- the safety settings
- filtering is applied to your home's WI-FI

Finally:

Don't leave setting up the device before you wrap it up!

Check the UK Safer Internet's 4 tips for giving tech gifts this Christmas including:

Discuss your expectations—make sure everyone understands the importance of staying stay safe.

Create a family agreement - a brilliant way:

- to think about how your family uses the inter-
- to help make sure that everybody understands the importance of staying safe and being responsible online.

You could include:

- daily screentime allowances
- where the device is kept at night
- approving friend requests
- permission to download or purchase apps
- use of social media Remember most social media sites have a minimum age of 13!

- Developers or hackers may be connected to your device without your knowledge
- Baby monitors, children's tablets, drone toys, can be hacked and used by people outside of your home.
