Nursery – Hedgehogs, Foxcubs & Squirrels – Mrs Stapley

Dear Families.

This week in nursery we have been learning all about spiders. The children have been very curious and excited to explore these fascinating little creatures.

Highlights of the week:

The children made their own spider webs using string and paint, and crafted spiders from paper plates and pipe cleaners.

Stories: We have read...

The Very Busy Spider and Spinderella and talked about how spiders spin their webs. We looked at pictures of real spiders and counted their legs together (always eight!).

Songs & Rhymes: Everyone enjoyed singing 'Incy Wincy Spider' with lots of actions and laughter!

We practiced counting using spider legs and sorted mini plastic spiders by size and colour.

Owls (Reception) – Miss Batstone & Mrs Rowcliffe

This week, the children have been exploring Harvest and early maths in exciting ways! We watched farmers harvesting crops and talked about the role of animals on farms. Using a UK map, the children discovered where different fruit and vegetables come from and why buying local is important. They enjoyed singing and clapping along to Harvest songs and created beautiful artwork of seasonal produce using chalk, collage, and crayons. Tasting local fruit and vegetables was a highlight, with children describing textures, smells, and flavours. They also worked together to write a fun acrostic Harvest poem full of adjectives. In maths, the children focused on the key principles of counting, practising one-to-one correspondence, cardinality, and saying numbers in the correct order. They explored subitising, different arrangements of blocks to 5, and the part-part-whole structure of numbers, discovering that numbers can be partitioned in many ways but the total remains











Year 1 - Mrs Roberts

In maths, the children enjoyed practical lessons exploring counting forwards and backwards within 10. Pretending to be astronauts, they hopped along a giant number line to show what one more and one less looks like. This active approach really brought the learning to life and kept everyone engaged. During English, Professor Klunk introduced us to the joy of The Everywhere Bear. The children loved reading the story and then inventing their own characters, maps, and transport for their cuddly toys. Alongside this, we have been working hard on our letter formation, using LetterJoin to support handwriting practice. We are also focusing on remembering capital letters, full stops, and finger spaces to make our sentences clear and accurate. Geography – We explored our village of Winkleigh and located it on the map, along with our county and our country. We also talked about where we live. Next week, the children will write their own addresses on a postcard and post it to themselves during our village walk. Please remember to send in a postage stamp in a













Year 2 - Mrs Keast

Year Two have enjoyed a busy and exciting week of learning. On Monday, the children made the most of the lovely weather by heading outdoors for gardening. They worked hard to clear weedy areas and planted bulbs that we look forward to seeing bloom in spring.

In English, our focus has been on recognising and writing different sentence types—statements, questions and exclamations. The children have also been building independence in their writing and paying close attention to their handwriting.

Maths lessons have centred on number lines to 100. Pupils practised placing numbers in the correct positions and enjoyed discussing their reasoning with each other, showing great mathematical thinking.

In Geography, we explored human and physical features. Using our new resources, some children were inspired to create their own landscape. One group designed an impressive model of "Westward Ho!" complete with pebbles, sand, the sea and even a car park!







Year 3 - Mrs Bourner

In Year Three this week, the children have continued thinking about place value in maths. They have compared numbers, thinking about numbers which are greater / less than and why. They have estimated where numbers will lie on a number line and had fun making their own number lines in the sunshine! We had an unusual Art lesson on Tuesday where the children thought about how Frida Kahlo might have felt lying in her hospital bed in a full body cast! They enjoyed lying on the floor with mirrors stuck to the underside of their tables, where they then drew their own self portraits! In R.E the children listened to the story of Creation and sequenced pictures to re-tell the story in their own words. In Geography, we have begun learning about the formation of volcanoes, linking our work to rocks and soils in Science. Making their own rocks using sweets was probably the highlight of the week for Year Three though! I wonder if you can remember the different types of rocks you made?







Year 4 – Mr Walter

In English, Year 4 have been working on planning letters using persuasive devices to stop the character chopping down the great Kapok tree. We have been exploring the use of fact and opinion alongside using direct address and emotive language to build a powerful letter explaining the importance of the rainforest. This links with our geography sequence where we have identified the locations of tropical rainforests in the world using an atlas to find which countries these rainforests are in. In maths, we have developed our knowledge of Roman numerals, identifying where we might still see them today whilst answer questions to convert numbers. I wonder if you could find any examples at home? In PE, we have focussed on how to travel from one location to another in gymnastics, focusing on rolls and different ways to walk with balance and posture. Additionally, we have developed our skills in tagging for tag rugby. We have enjoyed playing the glockenspiel in music, playing as part of an ensemble and continuing to practice using cross-stich in art.

Year 5 - Mr Saltearn

A great week in Year 5 this week. In Maths, we have started our new sequence on addition and subtraction. We have been learning about adding and subtracting numbers using mental methods, thinking about how we would solve different questions and explaining our reasoning. We have also started to learn about adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers. In English, we have continued our sequence on the Great Adventures and have been learning about using parenthesis to add detail to our sentences using brackets. We have also been working on identifying if a piece of writing is written in the first or third person and how we identify which. This week in PE, we have been practicing our basketball skills focusing on our passing and applying it to a game situation. The children really enjoyed adding detail to their clay tile, thinking about how they can add different textures to their designs. Have a great weekend Year 5!







Year 6 - Miss McLean

Year 6 have continued to work exceptionally hard during their English lessons this week and have all produced some incredible pieces for our shared writing, retelling the story of Beowulf. They are looking forward to creating their own individual monsters to write about next week. In maths, we have learnt about factors and multiples this week. We have also learnt some rules to find out if larger numbers are multiples of 3, 6 and 9 as well as using factor trees to find the prime factors of large numbers. In music, we continued to learn to sing the song Hey Mr Miller. This week we discussed the key vocabulary 'arpeggio' and 'syncopation' and had a go at singing some difficult syncopated rhythms. On Wednesday afternoon, the children did a fantastic job in the school garden, working as a team to move some strawberry plants and to clear an area of weeds and soil. Finally, it was great for some of our Year 5 and 6 children to be involved in our first sporting event of the year – well done to all that were involved and thank you to Mr Walter for organising this.
