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Big Changes Ahead for Key Stage 1 and Nursery

September 2025

We are incredibly excited to announce some fantastic changes coming this September for our Key Stage 1 and Nursery children!

From the start of the new school year, Years 1 and 2 will be moving into a brand-new space relocating to what is currently the Nursery Pod and our brand-new Cabin. Year 2 will use the Cabin for their main teaching sessions, while Year 1 will be based in the Pod. Both classes will then come together in the Pod to explore, create, and learn through their daily tasks. Each area will have its own cosy book corner and structured displays to celebrate the children's learning. The cabin will be used for small group work, structured interventions and focused teaching and learning.

We've also reimagined parts of our curriculum to make the most of this exciting new setup! Both classes will now take part in weekly Forest School sessions in the Pod Garden, led by Mrs Rowcliffe, who is now a fully trained Forest School leader. We are also working on developing a dedicated forest school area for Key Stage 2, with sessions throughout the year. Plus, there will be weekly cooking sessions using the Pod's small kitchen, giving children hands -on experiences that bring learning to life. We believe these new opportunities will spark curiosity, build independence, and enrich our already vibrant curriculum.

Thanks to generous grants secured by Mr Slocombe, we have been able to invest in a whole host of amazing new resources for the outdoor space. Children will be encouraged to be outside as much as possible, so we will be asking for all children to keep a pair of wellies in school. The garden and indoor / outdoor room will feature a dedicated construction zone, imaginative role play areas, and plenty of space to explore and discover. We will also have a specifically designed sensory area.

Lunchtimes for Year 1 and 2 will continue to be enjoyed together and will be in the school hall. We are adding new steps at the side of the Pod to make access smooth and simple. Most importantly, our Key Stage 1 children will still be very much part of the whole school community, joining assemblies and mixing with older children through our brand-new Tree Group Book Club sessions—a fantastic way to share stories and build friendships across the school.



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Exciting Nursery and Reception Changes

September 2025

We are absolutely thrilled to finally share the exciting changes coming to our Nursery and Reception areas this September! After months of planning and preparation, our Early Years spaces are getting a full makeover—and we can't wait for the children to enjoy everything that's coming.

Our Nursery will be relocating to the current Key Stage 1 area, comprising of three spacious rooms tailored to suit our youngest learners.

One of these rooms will become home to our youngest children (ages 9 months to 2 years), who will be known as the Hedgehogs. Over the summer, a specially designed, age-appropriate garden is being created just for them, ensuring a safe and stimulating outdoor space. This area, currently Year 1's classroom, will be transformed using a significant grant we were lucky to receive—allowing us to purchase a wide range of high-quality, purpose-built equipment.

Our Fox Cubs and Squirrels (children aged 2 and above) will be moving into what is currently the Reception classroom. This space will be enhanced with a new, all-weather shelter, and access to a flat garden area—offering a much more suitable outdoor environment than before. We have also invested in incredible new resources to support imaginative play, creativity, and curiosity across all nursery age groups.

To make drop-off and collection easier for our families, we are also creating a new dedicated gate and entrance specifically for the nursery, offering smoother access and helping the youngest children settle quickly into their day.

Meanwhile, our Reception children (Owls) will be moving into the current Year 2 classroom, which will be transformed to meet the needs of our thriving Reception cohort. Over the summer, the bandstand area will be enclosed, making it usable in all weathers and extending the learning space. Children will also enjoy direct access to the bike track—a favourite amongst our Reception children! In addition to all this, the Owls will join in with weekly Forest School sessions led by our fully trained leader, Mrs Rowcliffe, helping to foster a love of the outdoors and hands-on learning.

We have been working behind the scenes on these developments since last September, and we are so proud of what's to come. These changes will provide our youngest learners with rich, engaging environments where they can explore, grow, and thrive—we cannot wait for you and your children to experience it all! Children will thrive in these inspiring new spaces and enriching experiences on offer, we know it is going to be a brilliant year!

Year 1— Mrs Keast

Year 1 had another busy and exciting week!

On Tuesday, we took part in a volleyball taster session where the children learnt how to pass the ball to each other and worked on their coordination and teamwork skills.

In Maths, we concluded our unit on place value within 100 and began our next unit on money. We will be learning to recognise different denominations and begin to unitise. Any opportunity to explore coins or notes at home and practise counting money will greatly support this learning.

In English, we finished writing our stories based on *Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave*. We have now started our new unit on instructional writing, beginning with writing instructions for how to make slime – a very exciting and hands-on experience in class!

Our trip to Westward Ho! beach on Wednesday was a highlight of the week. It enriched our History topic, *Holidays in the Past and Present*. We explored how the area has transformed from farmland into a popular seaside resort. The RNLI spoke to us about their vital work keeping people safe at sea and on the beach. We rounded off the day with fish and chips and a delicious Hocking's ice cream.

On Thursday, we had a wonderful time taking part in some traditional Morris dancing – a lively and fun way to end the week!





Year 2—Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have had another exciting week! On Tuesday, we were visited by the Fireball Volleyball company who led a fantastic workshop! We learnt lots of new skills and practised our volleyball technique.

Wednesday saw us visit the beach with our peers from Year 1, taking part in rock pooling and learning more about the habitats with the rangers. We enjoyed a delicious lunch from Atlantic Bay and a Hocking's Ice Cream!

Our history topic has taken us deeper into the world of the Anglo-Saxons, as we explored their beliefs and the role of paganism in their daily lives. Also, with Sports Day just around the corner, we've been working hard during our field events to earn points for our tree groups. Finally, we have started our quiz week early to ensure we have time to talk about Escot next week. Everyone is very excited for their Year 4 residential. I'm sure there will be some eager children ready to pack bags over the weekend.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

A busy week in Year 5. We have started our new sequence in English and have been thinking about how we can add detail to our writing and have been writing a sentence and working in pairs to edit and add extra detail into them.

In Maths, we have been learning about negative numbers and finding the difference between two numbers.

On Tuesday, we took part in the fire volleyball session, the children really enjoyed the session and learning new skills.

In Science, we have been learning about air resistance and have been planning our experiment. We are testing to see if the size of a parachute will affect how the parachute falls. The children have the task to successfully build a parachute to bring their "hard boiled" egg down to earth.

Yesterday, Year 5 were busy practicing for sports day and enlisted some Year 6 helpers to help us record some of our throws.

Year 6-Miss McLean

Year 6 have worked incredibly hard on their final piece of writing for our sequence on Shackleton's Journey in English this week. They have written some fantastically well thought through pieces and demonstrated all of the writing skills that they have learnt. In maths, we have also finished our final sequence on algebra by learning how to solve problems with two unknowns.

In science this week, the children recorded the results from last week's experiments and wrote an evaluation of their work. They found out a lot about how exercise can impact heart rate and heart health.

On Thursday morning, the children took part in a live online lesson linking to their work using micro:bits. They have learnt a lot about how to use and programme a mini computer including for prompts in a dance routine as well as using them as a fortune teller.

On Tuesday afternoon, the children took part in a fireball volleyball session and learnt a lot about different skills and techniques involved in the sport.

Finally, on Monday next week Year 3&6 are looking forward to their visit to our federated school King's Nympton for a day of sporting activities. They will need to remember to come to school in PE Kit for this.



Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
