Year 1— Mrs Keast

We've had a lovely first week back after the half-term break and the children have settled in brilliantly. We started the week with Gardening Club, planting seeds that the children were excited to take home.

In English, we began our new book, Mrs Armitage and the Big Wave. The children have really enjoyed diving into the story, especially acting out parts of the book and moving to music linked to the sea. We've also been learning about nouns and how adjectives help us add more detail to our sentences.

In Maths and Computing, our focus has been on position and direction. The class loved using the Bee-Bots to follow instructions and guide them around a map. We've been practising key words like forwards, backwards, left and right.

In Art, we brought our learning to a close with a fantastic collaborative project. Each table group created a final artwork inspired by Henri Matisse. The children consolidated everything they've learned in this unit — from complementary colours and organic shapes to thinking about how art makes us feel. We even set up our own gallery in the classroom to proudly showcase our masterpieces!

We ended the week with lots of laughter at the Friday Fun Fair. Year 1 had a

fantastic time trying out all the activities – and especially enjoyed the chance to sponge the teachers! We're also getting very excited about our upcoming Key Stage 1 trip to The Mole Resort.

Year 2-Mr Slocombe

Year 2 have had a great week back for our final half term!

We have had a superb afternoon enjoying the Federation Fun Afternoon, huge thanks to Mr Walter for organising such a great day for us!

Wednesday saw us looking our smartest for our new class photo, narrowly avoiding being caught in a downpour!

In the classroom, we have been learning about the vocabulary in the story of the *Lighthouse Keeper's* Lunch'. We have considered our likes, dislikes, puzzles and patterns related to the text.

Meanwhile, maths has seen us complete our time sequence. We have been learning about the number of hours in the day, the days of the week and the months of the year. Next week, we will begin our work on statistics!

Year 3- Roman Day was a fantastic experience that truly brought history to life for the children. They thoroughly enjoyed learning about the Celts and handling a range of Roman artefacts. A highlight of the day was meeting a Roman soldier, who taught them all about life in the Roman army, including the weapons they used, the armour they wore, and the food they brought with them. The children were fascinated by the clothing and customs of the time, and the immersive, interactive activities helped deepen their understanding of Roman Britain in a fun and memorable way.

In English The Paper bag Prince has been used. The children have been making quality vocabulary choices in their writing.

In maths, they have been reminding themselves how data can be shown in graphs. The end of the week brought The Federation FunDay- a fantastic experience for all!

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

A fantastic first week back in Year 5. In English, we have recapped the story of *The Tear Thief* and have followed the pattern of the story to create our own journey of The Tear Thief through school. We have also started to build a description of the town and the Tear Thief.

In Maths, we have continued our learning about decimals and this week have been adding and subtracting decimal numbers using a range of methods to help us solve a range of problems.

They have got to know the story of the expedition and on Thursday had a go at writing some fantastic diary entries from the perspective of the crew members. The children conducted some research about the lives of each person on board the ship.

We have started learning about algebra in maths this week by looking at function machines. On Monday and Tuesday, they learnt about how function machines work and on Tuesday began to put letters into these function machines to show how each of the four operations would work with algebraic expressions.
