

Dear families.

This week in the nursery we have been exploring the theme of families and enjoying the beautiful story Owl Babies by Martin Waddell.

What we've been learning:

Story time: The children loved listening to Owl Babies, a tale about three little owlets waiting for their mummy to return. We talked about how the owls felt—sometimes worried, sometimes brave, but always caring for one another.

Families: We have been sharing who is in our own families and celebrating how every family is special and unique. The children enjoyed drawing self portraits and talking about people who are important to them.


Feelings & belonging: We've explored feelings of comfort, love, and reassurance, just like the owlets waiting for their mummy.

Creative fun: The children made owl crafts using feathers, paint, and collage materials. We also practised moving like owls. Below is an owl themed song we have been enjoying each day!

Reminders: Make sure children are sent in with a bag containing all their changing essentials i.e. nappies, wipes, nappy sacks and plenty of spare clothes. Only trainers or shoes that children can move freely in and that they can manage to take off and put on independently. A drinks bottle containing water. Thank you for your continued support.

Owls (Reception) – Miss Batstone & Mrs Rowcliffe

This week, the Owls have been developing their mathematical understanding through an exploration of the "five-ness of 5." The children reflected on how 5 is one more than 4, practised careful counting, and ordered numbers from 1 to 5 with growing confidence. In English, we continued to enjoy a range of stories and books. The children made predictions about what might happen next and discussed the events, characters, and settings with interest and enthusiasm. In topic work, the children created baby owls and explored the difference between nocturnal and diurnal animals. This sparked thoughtful discussion and enabled them to make meaningful connections between their creative work and the wider world. During Leap into Life, the Owls practised moving, jumping, and balancing. These activities supported physical development while also encouraging focus, coordination, and perseverance. Throughout the week, the Owls reflected on our school values of respect, resilience, and kindness, demonstrating these in both learning and play.













Year 1 – Mrs Roberts

The children are settling brilliantly into their new routines and are really enjoying the space in the KS1 area. It is lovely to see them mixing with their Year 2 peers whilst also enjoying a focused learning space.

In English, we began our *Curious Quest* concept week. The children were amazed to discover a letter in our class portal (the birdhouse in our tree) from Professor Klump, who explained that he needs their writing to power his Big Dream Machine. The children were excited to help and came up with imaginative inventions, and write their very own codes (sentences) to make those invention work all whilst remembering to use capital letters and full stops in their sentences. In Maths, we continued consolidating our understanding of place value within 10 through practical activities such as number matching and representing quantities using counters and ten frames. In Science, we explored the properties of materials, using words such as hard, soft, shiny, smooth, waterproof, flexible and absorbent to describe them. In Art, the children created circular natural artwork in the style of Andy Goldsworthy, using only resources they found outdoors. We have certainly finished off another exciting week of discovery and learning in Year 1!



Year 2 - Mrs Keast

Year 2 have had another busy week of learning. In English, we have been enjoying the story No-Bot. The children have found it very funny. Alongside the humour, we have been focusing on key vocabulary and exploring word meanings. We are also focusing on our handwriting. In Maths, our focus has been on numbers to 100. We have been working hard on partitioning numbers and thinking carefully about tens and ones. The learning has linked to the text '100 Birds'. The children have enjoyed exploring how numbers can be partitioned in flexible ways, and they have been eager to share their strategies during discussions.

In Science, our investigations have continued as we tested different types of plastic. The children thought about whether plastic would be a suitable material to use for house building and offered some thoughtful reasons for their ideas. Using a pipette and water to test for absorbency was fun and stimulated lots of discussion. Looking ahead to next week, on Monday afternoon we will be gardening instead of our usual PE. Please ensure your child brings a named pair of wellies in school (if we don't have a pair here already). Please also remember a water bottle and a coat each day.





Finally, every child has been given a Times Table Rock Stars login, which also provides access to our free trial of Numbots. The children are excited to use these and

will also be able to access this in school.

Year 3 – Mrs Bourner

In Year Three this week the children have continued to focus on place value in maths. They have looked at adding and subtracting 1,10 and 100, thinking about how the numbers change as we add and subtract. In English we have moved onto our new teaching sequence; 'Lord of the Forest.' The children have enjoyed listening out for new, powerful words within the book. They have begun to look at direct speech as well as think about nouns and verbs found within the story. In Science, the children began investigating rocks this week, learning the names for different types of rock as well as looking at how they look and feel similar, or different. We thoroughly enjoyed our time outside in the garden on Thursday and it was lovely to see the children working so well together as a team. Please can children be reminded to bring their star reader books as well as their library books to school with them every day.







Year 4 - Mr Walter

Year 4 are really proud of the work they completed in English for our inspirational people sequence focusing on the work of Marie Curie. We have now moved onto a sequence focusing on The Great Kapok tree. This week, we have discussed the dilemma and resolution whilst introducing the us of prepositional phrases. In maths, we have worked on the representations of numbers up to 10,000 using a number line to both show and estimate various numbers. We have enjoyed looking at the glockenspiel in music, following on from learning the key vocabulary. In geography, we identified the different biomes of the world, researching information about the climate that each one has. It was interesting to find out which animals live in certain parts of our world. In RE we identified the different Gods and Goddesses in Hinduism. We were able to discuss what they represented before thinking about what we would like to represent if we were a deity. **We look forward to our**

Year 5 - Mr Saltearn

A great week in Year 5! This week we have finished our sequence in English about inspirational people and the Civil Rights and have created a piece of writing that illustrates why Harriet Tubman is an inspiration. We have started to look at our new book, Great Adventures, and have been familiarising ourselves with the text and making inferences based on the cover. Yesterday, we investigated how we tell which tense a piece of writing is written in and how we know this. In Maths, we have been learning about rounding numbers to 100, 000 and explaining our reasoning behind our answers. We have also been identifying mistakes and offering advice in examples to further our understanding. In Geography this week, we have been learning about how mountains are formed and have created a diagram illustrating how tectonic plates can form a mountain and how high a mountain has to be. Last Friday, Year 5 and 6 went on our joint trip and took part in a range of different activities, it was fantastic to see everyone encouraging each other and working together as a team across the two year groups. 
Year 6 - Miss McLean

Year 6 have launched into their next English sequence based on the story of Beowulf. We have read the story, discussed some of the rich vocabulary and considered what techniques the author Kevin Crossley Holland has used to create tension throughout it. In maths this week we finished our sequence on place value and have started looking at the four operations. The children tackled some tricky questions with their excellent resilience to begin the sequence. Next week, we will look more at factors, multiples, prime numbers and square numbers. In Science, the children carried out an investigation to prove that light always travels in a straight line. In geography, they learnt how to read an OS map using 4-and 6-figure grid references. Music involved learning a new song with a South African influence, a catchy tune and some movements to match the character. Finally, in PE we started our tag rugby sequence by practicing the core skills needed in a game. In hockey, we practiced some controlled passing and attacking techniques.
