Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

Owls have worked so hard at all they have done this week and it is wonderful to see them becoming so independent in their learning.

Our Drawing club book this week has been *'The Naughty Bus'* which the children have loved. They have enjoyed retelling the story in their own words, designing and making their own 'naughty buses' and coming up with lots of mischievous ideas for their stories.

In maths, we have been looking at odd and even numbers. The children have sorted numicon based on whether it is odd or even, looked at odd and even patterns and found doubles numbers. *I wonder if you can find any odd or even numbers around the house this weekend Owls?*

Year 1— Mrs Keast

This week in our Curious Quest we have been reading *The Perfect Pet* by Fiona Roberton. We have written about our own perfect pet and have used 'because' to explain our reasoning. We have also written a letter and a list as part of the week's writing.

In Maths, we have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Any opportunities to do this at home would be really beneficial – counting coins is particularly good for this. We have also been learning to make equal and unequal groups – using the natural resources in the garden. At the end of the week we have learned about arrays.

In RE we have been learning about Jewish artefacts. We saw some video clips of the artefacts being used. We also had some real artefacts to view in the classroom. Everyone was interested in the dreidel game and enjoyed spinning the wooden pieces!

Please can everyone remember to bring a sunhat and wear suncream before school when we have hot days. We are encouraging the children to drink plenty and seek shade when outside. It has been lovely this week to use the outdoor area for lots of our learning opportunities.



Year 2—Mr Slocombe

What a wonderful week in Year 2 - both in terms of weather and learning!

English has seen us continue our sequence based around the weather, learning about weather idioms; using multi-clause sentences; and using repetition as a strategy for cohesion.

In maths, we have focused on money. We have thought about selecting coins appropriately, making the same amount and spending our money in the pet shop!

Meanwhile, in geography, we learnt about different elements of the weather, tying our learning across the curriculum together.

In art, we learnt about the context of the 1940s, creating our own Jackson Pollock inspired artwork.

Year 3- Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Manning

The year 3s have been working hard this week, despite the glorious heat! They have been working on developing descriptive vocabulary to describe flowers.

In maths they have continued their work on capacity and volume.

Cricket on Monday was very popular and we will continue this in class PE lessons.

The children have been learning about flowers in science and have constructed an investigation to look at what makes plants grow...or not!



Year 4—Mr Walter

It has been a lovely week in the sunshine in Year 4. This week, we started by enjoying our cricket workshop with Martin Brice from the Devon Cricket Foundation. This was a taster day to learn new skills and games to develop our striking and fielding understanding.

In English, our focus this week has been on adverbials. We have explored the myth associated with the demi-god Maui. Throughout the week, we have been carefully deciding which

adverbials to use to describe the action using where, when and how. We have also been reading carefully to find and use fronted adverbials appropriately.

In maths, we have completed the first half of our decimal sequence. We have used place value charts to represent our decimal numbers and gattengo charts to show how we can divide by tenths and hundredths whilst making connections with fractions that we have learnt previously. We have also started to practice our times tables in a timed format for the multiplication check in June. Any additional practice at home would help massively.

The warm weather we have had this week linked with our learning in geography about the different climates in North America. We compared the average rainfall, temperatures and sunlight hours between various cities across the continent. Whilst also comparing to our climate in the UK.

Finally, in art we used magazines and newspapers to create our own collage. We explored the importance of placement when thinking up a design and the way layering can help to build texture.

Year 5— Mr Saltearn

It has been fantastic to welcome back year 5 after their residential last week and all the challenges they faced and over came. The team work, resilience and kindness they showed through the week was amazing.

This week we have continued with our English sequence on Tuesday and the children have started to draft their opening to their own newspaper report on the book. We have been busy looking at how we can make our writing more cohesive and have been working in teams to edit and improve our writing adding more detail and varying our sentences and vocabulary.

In Maths, we have been learning about angles around a point and along a straight line and have taken advantage of the sunshine to take maths outside to complete a treasure trail. The children worked in pairs to find missing angles and complete the challenge of finding all the letters.

In Science, we have been learning about the different planets and ensuring we can remember the order of them, we created our own sentences to help us remember the planets. We have also learnt about the geocentric and heliocentric theories.

On Monday, the children enjoyed the cricket workshop and had a chance to practice some

different skills and apply them into different games.

Year 6—Miss McLean

Year 6 have enjoyed making the most of the lovely weather this week! On Monday, they took part in a fantastic extra PE session with a focus on cricket.

We have spent some time in maths and English lessons this revising our learning throughout the year. The children have kept a positive attitude throughout this and have enjoyed some teamwork tasks.

In science this week, we learnt about the functions of blood. The children had many insightful questions about what blood is and how it works. We learnt about red blood cells, white blood cells, platelets and plasma and the function of each part.

In geography, we used atlases to find given places on a world map based on the longitude and latitude coordinates. There was a brilliant show of resilience in this lesson as it's a tricky skill to learn!

In art, the children created some mood boards to support them in creating their final piece. Each child has chosen a media they would like to work with based on the art sequences they have completed since Year 1.

Finally, in PSHE we started our 'Being my Best' sequence by considering the children's aspirations for their futures.
