### Year 6

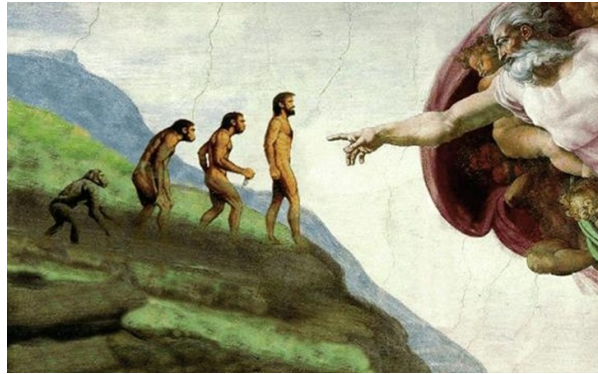
#### Prior Knowledge

#### Future Knowledge
