

## HOME LEARNING



EXPECTATIONS

Owls	Children in Owls Class are expected to read every night at home for at least 10 minutes. Parents are kindly asked to write in their child's reading record book.
	Please encourage and support children to use a knife and fork correctly. Children are expected to use cutlery properly as part of the early learning goals.
Year 1	At least 10 minutes reading per evening. Additionally, as much shared reading as possible, where the children just get to enjoy stories with their parents/carers.
	Tricky words that are the focus for the week will be sent home every Monday, it would be helpful if these could be turned into a game for the children to locate and find (for example, parents can pop them on post it notes and put them around the house).
	The Phonic focus for the week will also be sent home on a Monday - support same as above.
	Seeing maths in real world - help counting out things, looking for numbers in the environment, for example on the sides of tins, sweet packets, and looking at the units of measurements.
Year 2	Spellings: Work on our weekly spellings 3-4 times a week.
	Reading: Read with an adult if possible each day, or 3-4 times a week.
Year 3	Reading – as much as you can but ideally at least 3 times a week.
	Spellings – list send home for each half term.
	Times tables - up to 12 x 12, prostice for 10 minutes around 2 times a weak
	Times tables – up to 12 x 12, practise for 10 minutes around 3 times a week.
Year 4	Read at least three times a week for 1 dojo, five times a week for 2 dojos. This should be recorded in their superstar reader book by the adult they read with or the children themselves.
	10 weekly spellings to practice and learn for spelling tests every Friday.
	Times tables practice for around the world challenge every Wednesday.
	A list of 10 spellings to be practiced and checked in school every Wednesday.
Year 5	
	Around the world times tables challenge to be practiced and checked in school every Friday.
	Reading expectations at home are that every child is actively reading a book between school and home or multiple books being kept separate.
	Read Theory logins will be shared soon to give more opportunity for this to be accessed at home.
Year 6	Reading at least five times a week.
	A list of spellings to be practiced and checked in school overy Monday
	A list of spellings to be practiced and checked in school every Monday.
	Around the world times tables challenge to be practiced and checked in school every Friday

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

### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

Owls have been busy learning all about Chinese New Year this week. We had a lovely time with some of the Nursery children on Tuesday learning Chinese dances, making lanterns and listening to the traditional story of the Chinese zodiac calendar. SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

### Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe

This week in Year 1, we have started our new English sequence (letter writing) based on the story of Dear Mother Goose. Through this story, the children have been revisiting their favourite nursery rhymes and trying to solve the problems that arise for the characters.

In Maths we have been looking at numbers to 50. The children have been investigating the composition of numbers by looking at pictorial images and by using concrete resources to build numbers. Also, they have been counting forwards and backwards using a number track to support them.

In Geography this week we have been looking at Scotland as part of our United Kingdom topic. The children were very interested in the Loch Ness Monster and have been busy drawing human and physical features of Scotland.

In Art the children are adding to their Kandinsky style paintings with weaving. We have quite a few natural weavers in the class.

In RE the children have been looking at the Muslim religion and were fascinated at the cleansing rituals that take place.

### Year 2—Miss Jones



The week has flown by once again. We have planned our independent write and we're excited to start it next week. I have been so impressed with the effort and hard work that everyone had been putting into their handwriting this week.

Year 2 have been responding to written and verbal feedback and some have completely transformed their presentation. Well done, let's keep this up!

In Maths we have tackled division and have been working with resources to share equally. We have done well and showed resilience when we have found things tricky.

We enjoyed a practical Science investigation on Tuesday when we investigated different materials to see which were absorbent. Lots of us were correct with our initial predictions!

In Geography we produced a sketch map of Winkleigh and applied our understanding of keys and symbols.

### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had another productive week! We have begun learning about money in Maths, we have been counting in pounds and pence and converting amounts. Today, we have added amounts of money and we will use this knowledge to calculate change next week.

We have continued to link our learning in English to our sequence about the UK in geography. We have learnt about persuasive language that we can use and we

will eventually be writing to Sunny to persuade him to visit Devon. We have demonstrated our knowledge of expanded noun phrases by showing it, using them in a sentence and explaining how we know we have used them.

In Geography, we have compared Winkleigh and Exeter, drawing on our trip and village walk.

We found out about Ramadan, Eid-ul-Fitr and fasting in RE and we considered magnetic poles in Science.

It's been fantastic to see so much reading at home continuing this week – keep it up!

### Year 4—Miss McLean

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It's been yet another busy week of learning in year four this week. In English, we have started looking at our new focus text 'Blue John' by Berlie Doherty. We made predictions of what the story might be using prompts such as the front cover of the book, the music that inspired the book and the names of each of the chapters. We also explored how characters' emotions change through a story by mapping them.

In Maths, we have continued our learning around multiplication and division and are beginning to explore a range of written methods to multiply 2-digit numbers by a 1-digit number. In Geography this week, we researched where our food comes from. We had a go at using food packaging to label a world map to show where they are imported from. *What can you find in your kitchen that has been imported from another country?* 

Finally, in Science, we learnt about electrical conductors and insulators by building some circuits to experiment different materials from around the classroom.

### Year 5-Mr Walter

Year 5 have had another brilliant week. In English, we have come to the end of our Short Stories sequence, we have had some fantastic stories that left the reader puzzled with plenty of mystery and unsolved questions. We have already started our next sequence of recounts through reports and journalism by writing a report on our visit from South West Water (more information on the next page).

In Maths, we have continued to develop our understanding of fractions by ordering fractions both greater and less than one while using our prior learning of multiples to help us find a common denominator.

This week PSHE and RE have continued to share cross-curricular importance, we have explored the meaning of right and wrong and researched who Mother Teresa was and the legacy she has provided. Additionally, we debated the risks of following a dare, we chose the topics to discuss and voiced our reasoning to highlight our viewpoints.

Finally, credit to the whole class as they earnt themselves an extra treat on Wednesday for reaching the next 1,000 dojo points, which is the figure we set at the start of the year. We are already striving for the next 1,000

### Year 6-Mr Davis

Dear all, Year 6 have had an amazing week this week. Starting with Maths, we are progressing through our sequence on decimals, fractions and percentages. Year 6 have been exploring equivalent decimals and fractions as well as exploring the idea of a recurring number.

In English, Year 6 have been practising writing in two styles using some revised grammatical terms. Firstly, they have been using adverbials to write a commentary of a Quidditch match. Then they have had to write a character biography in the style of a chocolate frog card using parenthesis to provide the reader with extra information. All of the children have created excellent pieces.

In RE, Year 6 have been exploring the scientific creation story this week by looking at Darwin's voyage to the Galapagos Islands. The children have learnt about the finches he studied.

In Geography, the children have each been allocated a South American country to use as a case study for the rest of the sequence. Their first task was to consider the human and physical geographical features of their country.

Finally, in Art, Year 6 have been perfecting their mark-making and printing skills with these single ink prints. I hope you can see how fantastic they are!

## YEAR 5

#### EDUCATIONAL VISIT FROPM SOUTH WEST WATER



### On Wednesday afternoon, Year 5 had a visitor from South West Water

The visitor from South West Water came in to expand on our geography learning sequence of water and rivers.

On arrival our first task was to think about what South West Water did. Sophie, the education officer was fantastic in expanding the different roles and responsibilities South West Water have in our area, while expanding on our rural area through a real focus on the upstream thinking initiative.

Everyone was able to show off their learning and understanding of the water cycle by using their key vocabulary of evaporation, condensation, precipitation, runoff and collection. Sophie then explained how water is treated, she brought in samples from the tap and her local river. To all of our surprise the river was no different to the tap. Although, we were able to identify the small bubbles that indicated the gases built up from the tap pressure to rightly compare the two.



Finally, Sophie explained all of the weird objects that have been found in the treatment works after being flushed down the toilet. Keys, false teeth, glasses and phones were amongst some of the strangest. We focused on the importance to not put oil down the sink and hair down the toilet alongside the main culprit of blocked sewers and fatbergs... the wet wipe (even flushable wipes are no good).

Year 5 did brilliantly to share the importance of how to save water, asking questions of how water supplies are affected in different seasons and weather conditions alongside the strategies to save our water.
