Dear Parents and Carers

We are very much looking forward to Thursday and Friday next week and the children's first residential. I am emailing today to remind you of the kit required and the itinerary.

It would be great if all the items that the children are bringing are clearly labelled so that they can be returned. School cannot accept responsibility for any lost, un-named items.

Possibly spare leggings/trousers if space to carry them. Again, ideally, long trousers and long sleeve t-shirt to avoid any unwanted insects! A jumper for the evening A thin, waterproof coat. A sleeping bag Trainers - they will <u>not need to bring wellies</u> as the weather has been dry! A towel 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Insect repellent spray and a tick hook if you have one - we have plenty if you don't. A roll mat A <u>small</u> cuddly toy if absolutely necessary - this will be the children's responsibility to look after. Sunhat/sun cream (weather dependent) A book Warm hat or clothes if they feel the cold. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Phones/tablets/electronic devices Money Sweets/fizzy drinks/glass bottles

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A packed lunch for Thursday - this should be at the top of their bag for easy access (we will provide food/snacks for Thursday afternoon/evening and Friday breakfast/lunchtime) • A refillable water bottle • Toothbrush/toothpaste • Nightwear - can just be shorts/T-shirt to swap into or pyjamas - they can wear clothing already listed if they are cold.

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Arrive at the Parish Hall car park by 8.45am. Please ensure that we hold the correct contact details and that any prescription medicine is given to Mr Saltearn 2. Travel to Winkleigh to meet our peers and then travel to Exeter. 3. Climbing and lunch at Clip and Climb, Exeter. 4. Set up tents and Forest School activities at Taw Bottom. 5. Pre-chosen fish & chips (or sausage/chicken nuggets!) meal at the campsite. 6. Campfire activities 7. Camping & sleeping (possibly!) 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Breakfast 2. Forest School activities on the campsite 3. Making own packed lunches for Friday 4. Tidying tents 5. Travel back to school 6. Children may be collected from school from the Parish Hall from 2.15pm on Friday, once all items have been reunited with their owners!

Prescription medicine must be handed to Mr Saltearn, the children may not carry this themselves for safeguarding reasons. Please do not pack any medicine in the children's bags, again for safeguarding reasons.
