

#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1

The Christmas spirit is definitely developing in our class. The naughty elf has been getting up to daily mischief and the class have really enjoyed seeing what new things he has been doing every day.

Reception have been thinking about the presents they would like for Christmas, written and made Christmas cards and found out why we give presents. In Maths activities, they have been learning about the number five, subitising and finding one more and one less for numbers to five.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have completed the unit for the *Bear and the Hare by* continuing the story for the two friends. They have also started a short sequence of learning using *The Jolly Christmas Postman* by *Allan and Janet Ahlberg*. They have loved listening to and talking about this book! In Maths lessons, Year 1 have been working with the numbers from eleven to twenty. They have been finding one more and one less for these as well as learning about the place value positions of ones and tens. Year 2 have started a unit of work on multiplication and division, which will continue into next term. They have started this by making and adding equal groups of objects.

Other lessons have included measuring the temperature inside and outside the classroom using a thermometer, taking part in the Santa Run (well done to you all) and practising the Nativity tableau ready for next week.














# THE LEARNING ZONE

at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
48 hours after their last episode

their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
4 days after the rash first appeared

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
