SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 1

It has been great to have all the children back in school after the Christmas holidays and we hope you all had a lovely break. Everybody has returned with a fantastically positive attitude to learning and have made a great start to the term. Reception have been working on sequencing, making maps of 'The Family's Journey' and learning about the wonderful book, *We're Going on a Bear Hunt* by Michael Rosen. They have also been discussing the seasons, the weather we are experiencing this winter and thinking about places that are special to them. In Maths, they have been comparing numbers to five using the terms: more, less, fewer and same.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have started a unit of work on traditional tales in English. They have started this by using The Three Billy Goats Gruff book. They have compared different versions of this story, described the characters using noun phrases and have been concentrating on recognising sentences and punctuating these correctly. In Maths, Year 1 have started a unit of work on addition and subtraction within twenty. Year 2 have been recapping 'groups of', 'lots of' and arrays, as well as moving on to multiplication sentences using the X symbol. In other lessons, the children have been weaving, thinking about what a food chain is, word processing and locating the main continents of the world on maps and globes Well done, *Class* 1, have a good weekend.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Class 2

Another busy week in Class 2. It has been fantastic to welcome the children back for the Spring term.

In English this week, Year 3 and 4 have been learning about informal and formal language and using the appropriate language when writing a formal letter. Year 5 and 6 have been identifying features of a formal letter and have been constructing an introduction to their letter to grab the reader's attention. In Maths this week Years 5 and 6 have finished their topic on Ratio and have started their new sequence on decimals and percentages. In Year 3 and 4 the children have continued their sequence on perimeter and have been finding the perimeter of rectilinear shapes.


In Geography this week we have been learning about renewable and non-renewable energy and the positives and negatives of each, also investigating the draw backs and the advantages of each. Year 3 and 4 debated for and against renewable and non-renewable energy.

In Science, Years 5 and 6 have been learning about dichotomous keys to classify leaves and types of questions to classify them. In Years 3 and 4 they have been learning about the characteristics of living and have used MRS NERG to learn about the 7 characteristics of living.

Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scables	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
