### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

### Class 1

This week, Reception have been learning about Bonfire Night, this week. They have been thinking about the story, Cinderella, after watching the brilliant pantomime on Monday. They have designed a ball dress for Cinderella, discussed their favourite bits of the pantomime and written an invitation for a ball. They have also been learning the number bonds for the numbers two and three, practicing their number writing for the numbers to ten and finding one more and one less of these numbers.

Year 1 and 2 have been learning how to extend sentences, what an exclamatory sentence is as well as how to recognise and write verbs in both the present and past tenses. In Maths, Year 1 have completed their unit of work on addition and subtraction and started a new unit all about shapes. They have been learning to recognise, name and compare some 3D shapes. Year 2 have completing calculations using pounds and pence and comparing amount of money.

Other lessons have included experimenting with shadows, finding out the main events of the Great Fire of London and making a wheel mechanism in DT.

### Class 2

Another busy week in Class 2 this week! Last week Oliver and Jago travelled to Winkleigh to play in a football tournament with Years 3 and 4 from Winkleigh. They both enjoyed the experience and representing the Federation. Thank you to Mr Slocombe for looking after them.

This week in Science Years 5 and 6 have been learning about why we have night and day and have been explaining this in their folders. The children enjoyed acting this out in class. Years 3 and 4 have been continued their learning about sound and have been learning about pitch and amplitude and identifying which sounds had greater pitch and amplitude and have created an explanation for each of these key terms.

In Maths this week Years 5 and 6 have continued their learning about fractions and have been converting mixed number fractions to improper fractions and improper fractions to a mix number fraction. The children have enjoyed applying their knowledge to their learning and we have used a game show quiz to test our knowledge. Years 3 and 4 have continued their sequence on multiplication and have been investigating multiplying 3 numbers together.

It is fantastic to see the children so engaged and enthusiastic about their times tables and really enjoying Times Tables Rockstars.

In English, we have continued our learning about Ernest Shackleton and biographies. We have discussed who we will choose for our end of unit task next week.





Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
