Class 1—Mrs Godly

We had a great visit to Winkleigh Primary School on Monday. All the children ate their lunches in their year group classes and then watched the M & M production of Aladdin. The children had a fantastic time, behaved brilliantly and really enjoyed themselves.

This week, Reception have learnt the last Phase 2 digraphs (sh, th, ng and nk). In other activities, they have been retelling and sequencing the story of Aladdin, creating their own genies and deciding on what wish they would choose to make. In Maths, they have been investigating 2D shapes, by making, finding, drawing and counting circles and triangles. I am sure they would love to go on a shape hunt around their homes looking for these shapes too!

In English, Years 1 and 2 have been practising and learning ways to improve sentences. They have been recapping noun phrases, using a variety of conjunctions and learning about the different types of sentences they could use. In Maths, Year 1 have completed their unit of work on 2D and 3D shapes by continuing their work on recognising, naming, sorting and making patterns with these shapes. Year 2 have completed their unit of work on money by continuing to find the total and difference in amounts of money and finding change.

In other lessons, the children have been finding out about Roald Amundsen's expedition to the South Pole and comparing the changes with exploring it now. They have also been testing the changes that can occur with puddles, beginning to make their own

fridge magnets and have started an RE unit of work about Christmas.

Class 2—Mr Saltearn

A busy week in Class 2 this week. We are quickly approaching December and the children are starting to get into the festive spirit. This week in English, we have started our new book and it's Christmas themed, the book is a build your own story pack and the children enjoyed a hot seat activity to get to know characters from the story cards.

In Maths, this week years 5 and 6 have started their new sequence on fractions and have been finding equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions. We have learnt about how we listen to music has changed through time and the children have been researching different decades of music.

In year 3 and 4 we looked about how music has changed from the 60s to the present day, the children enjoyed listening to some of the 60s music.

On Monday the children travelled to Winkleigh to watch the pantomime, they all had a great time and told me they couldn't stop Mrs Godly from dancing!

Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
