#### SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Class 1

We have had a busy week preparing for the start of our Christmas celebrations in school. Our classroom is looking very Christmassy now (thank you to the elf- Mrs Blacker) and the class are getting more excited every day!

Reception have been finding out about the Nativity story and have written their own letters to Father Christmas. In Maths activities, they have been learning about the number four and developing their positional language through reading and drawing maps for the story, We're Going on a Bear Hunt.

In English, Year 1 and 2 have been considering how Bear might feel when he wakes up on Christmas day for the first time ever, what he and Hare might say to each other and written a description of how magical Christmas is. In Maths lessons, Year 1 and 2 have been recapping the areas of Maths they have been learning this term.

Other lessons have included making a windsock and learning about how we can measure wind speed in our Science lesson. The children have also been finding out about how London was rebuilt after the Great Fire, making their own moving picture, painting using pointillism on a computer and creating a winter's day dance.

Our class elf hid all our chairs this morning. We had to follow a list of clues to find them. He had put them under the table tennis table!



Families with children in Class 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Kings Nympton Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.

It takes less than a minute to apply.
