#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

I cannot believe we are at the end of the first half of the spring term already. What a busy few weeks we have had! This week in class the children have had fun creating paintings inspired by Jackson Pollack using his 'active art' method. They enjoyed listening to music while being creative and loved watching the colours mix.

In maths we have been counting and combining groups and talking about how many we have got **altogether**. In phonics we have continued to look at longer words, trying to spot double letters and digraphs and learning how to 'chunk' words into smaller parts to read them.

As part of our topic work on The Seasons, the children loved listening to 'After the Storm' on Wednesday and worked so well together to build dens, shelters and houses for the animals for the animals to live in. As the children loved this book so much we have decided to continue with our Percy the Park Keeper theme for a few more weeks after half term. If you do have any stories in this series we would love it if the children could bring them in after half term to share with their peers.

#### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast


We have had a busy but fun final week of the half term and are all ready for a week off! In English this week we completed our English sequence based on the book 'Dear Mother Goose'. We have put our letter-writing skills to the test, writing letters both to and from Mother Goose. This has given us an opportunity to use our creativity but also apply our writing skills to a task with purpose. We have remembered to put an address and a date at the top of our letters. After half term we will begin a new sequence based on the book 'Creature Features'.

In Maths we have completed our unit of learning about numbers to 50. This week we have been ordering numbers between 0 and 50 before moving on and counting in 2s and 5s to 50. This is something which you could practise at home using 2p and 5p coins! Can you write down all the numbers you would say if you counted in 2s and 5s to 50?

In Geography this week we completed our learning about the UK. We discussed all four countries which form the United Kingdom and what we have learned about each of them. We loved using Google Earth to explore the UK and this is something which you could have a go at doing at home if you can access the internet.



As part of Safer Internet Day, we have had lots of discussion about safe use of the internet and what rules we can remember. We talked about the benefits of using the internet and what we enjoy watching and playing online. We also know what to do if something online worries us.

Half term is here and we have all continued to work hard this week. In English we explored areas of grammar relating to our traditional tales teaching sequence. We compared two different versions of the story before looking at statements, exclamatory sentences and commands.

In Maths we have begun our new sequence. We recognised equal groups, made them practically and wrote addition and multiplication number sentences. Across the foundation subjects we have been doing our end of unit assessments

ready for our new sequences to start after half term.

I hope that parents and carers enjoyed looking at our learning in English and Maths in the open morning on Friday.

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

I can't believe that we are halfway through the year! Year 3 have enjoyed writing their letters to Sunny from Meerkat Mail, persuading him to visit the United Kingdom. We have applied our learning from geography, as well as making comparisons between Exeter, Winkleigh and London. In maths, we have finished our sequence around length and perimeter, learning how to measure and calculate the perimeter of shapes.

After half term, we will turn our attention to fractions. Our science sequence of magnets has drawn to a close and we have used our understanding to explain how magnets will interact with other, using key terms such as magnetic poles and fields.

On Monday, we evaluated our final pieces that we created in art based on Vincent Van Gogh's sequence and these have now come home.

#### Year 4—Miss McLean

This half term has flown by in Year Four! In maths this week, we concluded our learning on length and perimeter by calculating the perimeters of rectilinear shapes and polygons. Can you remember the difference between regular and irregular polygons?

In English, we have focused on grammar features such as inverted commas and apostrophes. We had a go at writing a postcard from the point of The Queen of Darkness to another character in the book to practice using these grammar features. After half term, we will continue with our learning based around Blue John to complete some extended writing using the structure of the book.

We finished our learning in the foundation subjects this week and used our folders to help us to recall our learning from the sequences before finishing our final pieces of work.

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

Where has that term gone?

Year 5 have been working hard to finish off all subjects this week, showing their learnt understanding through discussion and challenge tasks to complete.

In English, we have been looking into the uses of commas, which also focussed on using relative clause, in our writing. Using our example text of "Eats, Shoots and Leaves" we have identified the different meanings of sentences and how commas clarify them. It allowed us to use our reading books and check for comma use, explaining why the author has used them.

In maths, we have come to the end of our sequence on fractions. Over the last week, we have been experimenting how to find a fraction of an amount.

At the end of last week, everyone was able to take their TingaTinga artwork home. This week, we have been evaluating the process we went through and explained how our artwork could be TingaTinga.

Finally, Year 5 and 6 were able to play in a school netball tournament of 6 teams. This gave the opportunity to put into place the skills and techniques we had learnt across this term's PE.

#### Year 6—Mr Davis

It has been a great final week of the half term and the children have worked really hard completing their teaching sequences. In English, Year 6 have been learning about non-fictional writing in the fictional world of JK Rowling. We started by exploring the Mirror of Erised and created a non-chronological report about the magical object. Then, in a class oracy project, the children had to work together to decide on individual, unique magical objects so that we could make our own class book - A Compendium of Wizarding Objects.

In Maths, the children finished their fractions, decimals and percentages sequence. The last objectives included finding percentages of amounts and solving multi-step problems.

In Art, the children completed their two-tone printing - with some fabulous results.







In IT, Years 5 and 6 took part in an eSafety assembly and worked really hard as a cohort, discussing some challenging issues.

The children also completed their final science lesson on animals and their habitats by considering how and why certain species appear to be perfectly suited to their environments. This links nicely to our next science sequence - Evolution and Inheritance.

Finally, Year 6 earned their Dojo point treat this week - reaching more than 1200 Dojo points for the year. Popcorn and a treat. A great way to end a brilliant half term. Enjoy the break!
