Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

This week in Owls Class the children have had great fun learning all about money. They have looked at different coins and worked out ways to pay for amounts where multiple different coins must be used. They have sorted coins according to size and colour, have created rubbings using the coins and have had fun buying items from the toy shop. Once again there has been some great mathematical language used in class this week. *It would be great if the children could practise using coins over the weekend to pay for real or pretend items.*

In literacy, the children have continued to work hard on learning their tricky words, playing games and looking for them within sentences. We enjoyed looking at different sized items of clothing as part of our PSED lesson on Thursday, linking this to the story 'You'll soon grow into them Titch.' The children loved showing the items they had brought in from home.

We have begun collecting in reading books and library books this week but would still encourage you to share books with your children as much as you can. The local libraries have a new summer challenge called 'Ready, Set, Read!' which is a great way of keeping the children interested in books over the summer break.

Year 1-Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast



Wednesday was the highlight of the week and we had a fantastic day at the beach in Bude!

In English this week we had great fun making slime! We have been reading recipes from the Slime book and have picked out some of the words we are unfamiliar with like 'polymer' and 'molecule' This has helped us to expand our vocabulary. We have also worked on some

grammar this week, changing statements into commands by adding imperative verbs.

In Maths we have been learning about time. We have been ordering events using the words 'before' and 'after' to help describe a typical day. We have been learning the days of the week and the months of the year using some fun interactive games and activities.

In PSHE we have learned to explain the difference between a secret and a nice surprise. We have read some story situations and identified them as being secrets or surprises. We have also discussed who we can talk to if we feel uncomfortable about any secret we are told, or told to keep.

Next week we are looking forward to spending Tuesday with Miss Jones for the transition day as we head towards Year 2!

Year 2—Miss Jones

Another busy week has flown by. In English we have started our poetry sequence and have explored different poems about our senses. We have been working on using descriptive language such as expanded noun phrases as we have structured our own poems, entitled I like and beach sounds.

In Maths we started our final sequence on position and direction. We have looked at using prepositional language like left, right, below and above when describing the movement of different objects.

In History we completed our assessment and recalled what we have learned during our food in the past sequence. We were able to describe the similarities and differences compared to the present day, such as the use of delivery bikes and vans and the fact that we can now get everything that we need from one supermarket.

In Science we also consolidated our learning about everyday materials and their uses during our assessment booklet. We thought about selecting the appropriate material for their uses and sorting materials into being man-made or natural, as well as whether certain materials are easier to change the shape of.

On Wednesday we thought about what it means to be a special friend and what qualities they may have. We had a fun competition during DT to see who could design the most creative piece of animal toast. There were some great entries! Have a good weekend everyone.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had a brilliant week! Lots of excitement around our residential at the start of the week, which fed into our writing! We have also focused on similes, metaphors and alliteration as part of our poetry sequence.

In maths, we have rounded off our statistics unit and we are now revisiting some of our prior learning and consolidating it. In science, we have learnt about how shadows form and change throughout the day due to the Earth's rotation.

History saw us compare modern Britain with Roman Britain, using this knowledge to complete our assessment task. Today, we have visited Monkleigh Primary School and had an excellent day learning more about rounders and orienteering as part of our PE curriculum.

Year 5—Mr Walter

It has been fantastic to be back with Year 5s this week! The whole class were excited to talk me through everything they have done in the last two weeks. On a personal note I would like to thank you all for your kind words and gifts, it means a lot to us all.

In the classroom this week, we have finished our independent writes on our own adaptations of The Tear Thief. There have been some well thought out examples of thieves who steal screams, dreams and frowns amongst many others. Similarly, our maths sequence of converting units came to an end with us reinforcing our understanding of the conversions between metric and imperial measurements as well as comparing mm and cm.



In history, we worked on creating our own timeline of the events in World War II, we had to think what were key events with the war and highlight some major events that occurred locally with Plymouth, Exeter and Winkleigh airfield all being added to our completed timelines. Science this week involved us conducting an experiment on the levels of friction different surfaces have on a toy car. We used different levels of force to test our hypothesis.

On Thursday, we have a garden day so please have wellies and appropriate clothing. I hope you all have a fantastic weekend, I look forward to talking with you at parents evening on Wednesday. Well done Year 5!

Year 6-Mr Davis



That is the end of the final 'full week' at school for Year 6! We have been finishing off all of the lessons that we had remaining. In English, the children's final sequence is based on a book called Human 2.0 which looks into how bionics are becoming more prevalent and what the ethical considerations are for us as a species. The children have learnt a lot of new, technical vocabulary and had a go at presenting their own bionic device to a reader. It has prompted some fascinating discussions.

In maths, we have been looking at some practical applications of some of the techniques we have been learning in the context of planning a holiday. The children have been converting units, interpreting statistics and calculating the mean in order to make their decisions.

In Art, the children have been building their technical drawing skills by practising creating art with two-points of perspective. This is a really challenging skill and some of the results were fantastic!

In History, the children learnt about the first Greek Olympics and compared them to the modern ones. There were a surprising amount of similarities! We have also had four major sporting fixtures this week: girls football, boys football, netball and cricket. I was so impressed by the children's attitude and the way they supported and encouraged each other. I hope you all have a lovely weekend.



Should I keep my child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
