# A note from the Head

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had lots going on this week. Our Reception class; Owls joined with Class 1 from Kings Nympton on a trip to Bear Town in Cullompton. The children loved dressing up and enjoyed playing hairdressers, shop keepers, vets and much more. What a fun trip! This was the first opportunity for children across the Federation to get together this term, and the children blended well as one group.

Year 2 enjoyed visiting Northam Burrows exploring living things and their habitats, making good use of their investigative skills.

Both groups were exceptionally well behaved. Well done all.

Year 1s had a visit from Jaz, from Devon Wildlife Trust. They identified tree species in our grounds, collected seeds such as acorns and tested if they floated or sank which indicated whether they would germinate and then planted them.

We will be arranging more sporting events and hope to get as many children across the Federation involved as possible.

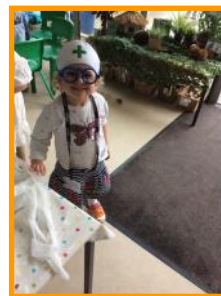
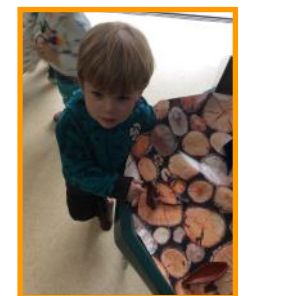
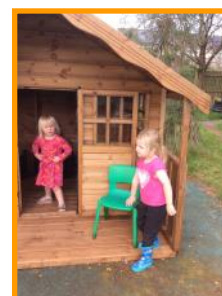
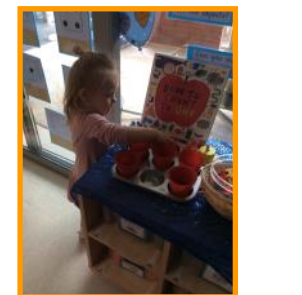
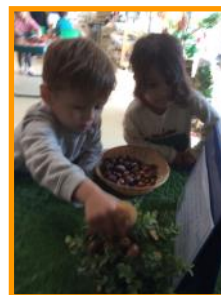
## Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley

## Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

The highlight of this week was definitely our trip to Bear Town on Tuesday. The children (and adults!) had a fantastic time dressing up and engaging in a range of different role play scenarios. Mrs Brook thoroughly enjoyed her trip to the salon and Mrs Bourner was very pleased at being served chocolate cake and coffee in the café! It was wonderful to see the children interacting so naturally with their peers from Kings Nympton School. They will join them for many trips over the next few years so it is lovely to see them already forming friendships.

Back in class the children have loved our maths work this week. We have focused on measures and have looked at different sizes, weights and capacities. They have ordered teddy bears by size, compared and weighed parcels and have used their maths skills to measure ingredients to make a delicious apple crumble whilst talking about the best size dish to both make it in and eat it from! In phonics they have continued to learn new letter sounds and are now beginning to put these letters together to build three letter words.

As part of our PSED work this week we have listened to The Colour Monster stories and have continued to think about our feelings. The children have thought about what they can do to calm down when they feel cross or angry, and how they can cheer someone up if they feel sad. ***I wonder if you can use your measuring skills this weekend Owls to find things that are heavy and light, or tall and short? Maybe you could help out with some cooking?***

## Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we began writing our own journey poems based on *The Train Ride* by June Crebbin. We have used the photos from our bus journey to Rosemoor as a stimulus. Towards the end of the week we have planned our independent writing, this time about a trip around Winkleigh. We have chosen our own mode of transport and a number of things that we will see on our journey. This has linked well to our Winkleigh village walk last week and our work in Geography this term.



In Maths we have been working on number bonds to 10 this week, learning which pairs total ten when added together. We have learned how to work through these systematically, ensuring that we find all the possible combinations. At the end of the week, we have been adding more to a given number. Linking this to our learning through stories and images.

In Geography this week we created a map of Winkleigh using objects in the classroom. We looked at a map of the village and discussed our trip out last week, talking about what we saw and which buildings we noticed. We used this to help us recreate the village in miniature form!



## Year 2—Miss Jones

Another busy week has flown by. In Maths we have continued to explore addition and subtraction by applying relative facts and using resources such as number lines and 100 squares to add and subtract a one-digit number from a two-digit number.

In English we have written our final version of the story 'Augustus and his Smile'. We are all working really hard on our letter formation and handwriting with lots of progress already made, well done everyone!

In Geography we compared Africa and Antarctica by thinking what is the same and different. In Art we had a go at resist paintings and applying techniques from Kandinsky to use white crayons and the primary colours to reveal our pictures.

Our trip on Wednesday linked brilliantly to our learning about living things and their habitats. Read on to find out more about what we got up to!

We have enjoyed making the most of our running track throughout the day, everyone has enjoyed challenging themselves to complete as many as they can.

## Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have enjoyed another super week, we have been really impressed by their mature and positive attitude to their learning and expectations!

In English, we have learnt about prepositions and adjectives. ***I wonder if you can explain what they mean at home?*** In the latter part of the week, we began our shared writing, practising what will be included in each paragraph of our narrative.

Maths has seen us practise exchanging 10 tens for a hundred or 10 ones for a ten when adding and subtracting amounts of tens and ones. This will support us in beginning to learn the formal column method next week.

During science, we learnt about the fossilisation process, sequencing the steps and describing what was happening in each. We worked practically in geography and designed earthquake-proof buildings, using a range of resources to construct models.

## Year 4—Miss McLean

It's been another fantastic week in Year Four. In English, we have continued our sequence on Poetry. We have looked at a few different poems and practiced spotting the rhyming patterns as well as identifying the purpose of them. We learnt that there are many different types of poems that can tell a story, entertain us and describe things.

In maths, we practiced subtracting 4-digit numbers with exchanges. We discussed that the word efficient means a quick and easy way of doing something and applied this to our subtraction. We learnt some other methods to subtract that were more efficient than exchanging in a column.

The children worked in their table teams to plan an experiment on melting in science that they will carry out next week. They discussed what equipment they will use and the method that they will follow.

In geography, we became news reporters to spread the word about how important tropical rainforests are. The children wrote reports to explain the importance of the rainforests as well as the things that we can do to help save rainforests from deforestation.

## Year 5—Mr Walter

This week in English, Year 5 have been exploring new activities to help learn new words and their meanings. In groups, everyone has come up with their own cricket that develops spelling and word knowledge.

In maths, using our knowledge of the inverse we have been able to round and compare numbers to find our answer.

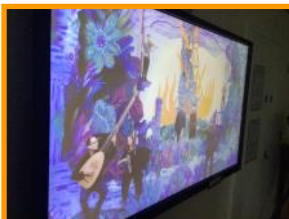
In geography, we have had a fantastic discussion on the impact humans have on mountain environments, creating a leaflet on a chosen mountain.

It was lovely to see the array of green today for Just One Tree day, dodging the bad weather to plant out some new plants in our garden.

## Year 6—Mr Davis



We have had a fantastic week up in Year 6 this week. In English, the children started their next sequence - Aidan - an opera adapted by the English Touring Opera company. They have learnt how it was adapted from an opera called Amadigi written by Handel in the 1700s. Year 6 learnt about the characters, their motivations and how they fit certain stereotypes before watching the first two acts. One lesson also involved thinking about lyrics and what makes them effective. The children read and then listened to some lyrics by Bob Dylan before considering the lyrics of Aidan.



In Maths, Year 6 have been focussing on multiplicative reasoning. We have practised the methods we need to be able to apply as well as learning how numbers can be manipulated to help us. There have been several challenges this week and the children have risen to them well.



In Science, the children have learnt a new term - refraction - and how this is different to reflection. They learnt how to label a light ray as an incident ray and then conducted an experiment involving a clear container of water and an object.

In RE, the children learnt more about the 10 Commandments and what effect they have on British Society. The children also attempted to rewrite the commandments in a manner more suited to modern times. Finally, in Geography, the children have been set a project: to design a new settlement to be built locally. Today's lesson involved writing a letter to a planning officer seeking permission to build their eco-settlements.

# YEAR 2 NORTHAM BURROWS



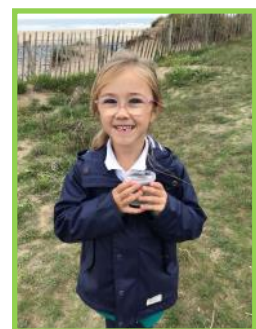
WEDNESDAY 11TH OCTOBER 2023

# Should I keep my child off school?

## Yes

### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started

Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
