What a fantastic week we have had in Owls Class this week learning all about Spain.

We started our week using google earth to 'fly' from Winkleigh to Madrid and looked at the differences between the two. We looked at where Spain is on a map and a globe and discussed the different climates in relation to their

proximity to The Equator. We discussed what we might pack in a suitcase if we were jetting off on holiday to Spain this week and all agreed that sun hats and suncream would be high on the list.

The children have enjoyed learning to count in Spanish, have played games using Spanish colour words and have been answering the register in Spanish all week. They thoroughly enjoyed looking at the architecture found in Barcelona, and we talked about whether Antoni Gaudi was a genius or whether he was 'bonkers!' Whichever the children decided, they had great fun creating their own lizards, dragons, salamanders and dinosaurs using the broken mosaic technique of trencadis.

We have also learnt some flamenco skills and I am sure you will agree, the children worked hard to make some amazing castanets which they have thoroughly enjoyed using to dance along to some Spanish music. We looked at foods that are grown and eaten in Spain and the children enjoyed making and eating their own tapas in the sunshine on Wednesday. This was

This week has been Art and Culture week. The country we have been learning about is India.

At the start of the week, Year 6 completed an escape room style task designed to teach them about the religions, regions and history of India. They worked in their table groups and showed great perseverance to complete the challenge!

Then, we cooked our first curry of the week - Temple Dhal. Again, all of Year 6 were keen to try the different spices and ingredients - especially the raw chilli! I hope you got the chance to taste the dhal because they did do a fantastic job.

In Art, the children have learnt about two different forms - Rangoli and Buta (more commonly known as Paisley patterns). They all had a really good go at some challenging pattern design - using mathematical equipment such a compasses to help structure their designs.

On Thursday, we visited the Exeter Northcott Theatre to watch Demon Dentist. Year 6 were a credit to the school and were excellent role models to the younger children, so well done.

We also linked this week's art project to our recent ICT stop-motion animation sequence - by animating a collage of petals and plants in the style of Rangoli.

Finally, Year 6 made their second curry of the week - a Keralan potato curry called Temple Aloo. Again, they were all keen to try the new spices that we used and were keen to learn new skills and techniques. What a week!

# Should I keep my child off school?



#### Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
