Year 3 went on their trip to RHS Rosemoor and had a fantastic day learning about germination, they were a credit to the school, as always.


Our youngest pupils took part in curriculum linked dance workshops with Katie from Step Up & Dance, which were a big success. Katie commented that the children were so enthusiastic.

NEWS FROM THE NURSERY





This is a short 5-week term but we have returned with a spring in our step ready for an exciting term of learning ahead.

This half-term we welcome Bonnie, Bonnie, Lucy, Denny, Elizabeth, Darcy, Chloe, Megan, and Robyn to Nursery. We are sure they will settle in quickly and soon become a huge part of our setting.

Our topic this half term is "Happy and Healthy". We will be focusing on the concept of 'Our Environment' and we will look at the different ways we can use our environment to stay 'happy and healthy' including growing fresh fruit and vegetables, cooking with healthy ingredients, being responsible for our own personal self-care, partaking in exercise both inside and outside and looking after our local environment by re-cycling, re-using and composting.



You won't fail to have noticed that we have a construction site opposite the school now! The children have been watching the progress of the build with fascination and we receive daily updates regarding the numbers of diggers they have seen! With this interest in mind we are planning to make changes to our outdoor provision, adding new planting, construction, and play areas which the children are helping design. You will be shortly invited to Our Great Garden Get Together so be ready with your trowels, forks and any plants you may have to donate from home. Refreshments will be provided.



As we all know Covid 19 has had a significant impact on young families and children. We are starting to see the toll this has taken nationally in areas such as speech and language development in young children and self-care. In all areas of health there is a distinct shortage of professionals who would have normally stepped in to help support young families with such issues. Locally we have seen a shortage of health visitors and group support. We are therefore looking at setting up a monthly parent 'get together' to allow parents to meet up and talk about issues which may be effecting them. Our staff will be on hand to offer support and guidance. I will be in touch shortly regarding dates.

Owls Class—Mrs Bourner


Despite this being a short week, Owls have squeezed so much fun and learning into the week! We welcomed Teigan into Owls Class this week and already she has become a real part of our wonderful class. Thank you Owls for making her feel so welcome.

The children had a fantastic time on Thursday during their dance workshops, zooming off into outer space and flying to the moon in their rockets! Their enthusiasm and enjoyment was wonderful to see.

Owls Class are continuing to enjoy our space theme and were both intrigued and fascinated to learn about the first moon landing this week, asking some great questions. They learnt that Neil Armstrong was the first person to step onto the moon and that Eleanor Foraker was one of the seamstresses that designed and made the space suits that the astronauts wore on this first moon landing. Both of these stories link to our topic of being resilient as part of our PSED topic and the children have been continuing to think about how they can show their own perseverance and resilience in many different ways.

In Maths, the children have been counting past 10 and have been looking at how to make numbers up to 10. They have thoroughly enjoyed playing games involving numbers up to 20 and have become rather competitive over beating their teachers!

In phonics, the children have been looking for vowels within words. Their letter formation is really developing and they were all so proud of their writing in phonics this week. Well done Owls.

















SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe

Year 1 have had another great week and have been working really hard. The children are really enjoying learning about Sri Lankan animals for our English unit of work. They have been looking at nouns and adjectives and how we put them together to create noun phrases in our writing. We have some lovely vocabulary on our working

wall, which we can use in our final piece of writing.

In maths we have been learning about multiplication, and in particular repeated addition. They children have been introduced to arrays as a visual representation of looking at multiplication, and identifying what a column is and what a row is.

Our Geography topic ties in really nicely with English as we are investigating Sri Lanka. The children have been finding out information to create a fact file. *Perhaps you could ask them what Sri Lanka is famous for?*

On Thursday we had an amazing dance workshop, the children were fantastic and worked really hard on perfecting their dance moves. The

workshop for year 1 was themed on rainforest animals to tie in with our English and Geography. Great work year 1.











Year 2—Miss Jones

It's been a busy week and the children came back ready to learn after the bank holiday.

In Maths we have continued learning about fractions and explored 1/2 and 1/4 in various representations. This week the children have been focusing on using key vocabulary in their written and verbal explanations. We have been doing a shared write in English and have applied our writing techniques that we learned over the last few weeks. There have been some imaginative ideas shared by the children and they are eager to start their upcoming independent write.

We have been weather watchers in Geography this week and have been looking at measuring the weather and comparing our findings. We learned that the weather is the conditions in a short period of time whereas the climate is the average daily weather patterns over a long period of time. We have loved learning raps in spelling this week to help us learn about suffixes. *Can you explain to someone the rules that Mr Spelling has taught you?*

Thursday was an exciting day as we had a dance workshop. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning a range of dances and behaved brilliantly as always. Have a great weekend all.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

We've had a busy week in Year 3! In English, we have planned and written our own poems based on the Magic Box by Kit Wright.

We have learnt about adding and subtracting fractions this week in maths and applied our knowledge to word problems and a range of contexts.

After our trip on Tuesday to Rosemoor, we have potted some plants and set up an investigation in science to test how water travels through plants. You can see more from our trip on page 8.

In Geography, we learnt about European countries and the locations of them using maps. Next week, we will discover more about Poland.

As part of our next English sequence, we will be writing instructions about monsters and creating our own, please could each child bring the cardboard tube of a toilet roll to transform into their own monster!

Year 5—Mr Walter

Well done to all in Year 5 this week. Tuesday morning was a huge success to explore different board games and ask relevant questions to extend into a report. Additionally, we have been looking into the importance of topic sentences to ensure our reports are cohesively detailing information. In Maths, we have been reinforcing the differences of angles by comparing and ordering have been able to use protractors to find how to measure these angles and label them accordingly using key vocabulary.

In Geography, we have looked into our own carbon footprints by conducting a survey to see what impact we are having on the world. Consequently, we will be able to expand on this knowledge on our trip next week.

We have been lucky this week with the weather on our PE days so we have explored the importance of attacking and defending in invasion games, ensuring we find space and understand the word agility.

Year 6—Mr Davis

I do hope you all enjoyed the bank holiday weekend. This week, Year 6 have continued their Greek Mythology sequence by looking at the story of Perseus and Medusa. Within this story, they had a go at improving some writing using colons and semi-colons to join clauses. We have also consolidated how the meanings of words can change using prefixes and suffixes.

In Maths, the children decided some concepts that they would benefit from recapping before next week. This week, we covered fractions of amounts, percentages of amounts and multiplying fractions.





In PE, Year 6 completed their first hands-on lesson on mentoring. Mr Gillard helped the children plan their activities (based around a chosen sport) and then invited the children from the Nursery down. Mrs Roadnight was so impressed by their kindness and maturity teaching the little ones PE. Year 6 learned about how and why the globe is divided to allow navigation as well as defined by its proximity to the sun.

In RE, the children have been learning the connections between four terms gnostic, agnostic, theist and atheist. They have been considering how the terms can be combined to describe a person's beliefs.

Finally, next week is SATs week. From Monday to Thursday, we invite <u>all</u> of the Year 6 children in for breakfast at 8.15am in the hall. Have a lovely weekend!
