NEWS FROM THE NURSERY



Recapping the story of Peter Pan, we have been focusing on Mermaid Lagoon this week. We learnt that mermaids are 'mythical' creatures with the body of a human and the tail of a fish. In Folklore, mermaids, like fairies, have magical powers. They love music and singing and captivate sailors with their beauty, often causing ship wrecks! We read stories about mermaids and how humans have forged friendships with them for centuries. We were fascinated to learn that when mermaids come out of the sea their fishy tails turn into legs. But that they are often miserable on land and want to return to the sea to be with their friends and family. Many conversations about friendship followed, what it means to be a good friend and how we can help and support one another when we are feeling sad.

The pictures in the books inspired us to paint mermaids of our own. We painted our feet with iridescent paint, (which tickled a lot!), and used the foot print to design our own mermaids, choosing unusual colours for their hair and adding sequins and glitter to decorate their beautiful tails.



Properties of water and how ships sail on the sea without sinking inspired our science activity this week. We looked at the concepts of sinking and floating and the properties different objects have which allow them to either sink or float. We all got very soggy as we experimented with various objects and guessed whether they would float on the top of our water tray or sink to the gloomy depths at the bottom.

On Wednesday we joined Mrs Bourner and Owls Class for a visit from the Dentist. We talked about which foods keep our teeth healthy and which foods we should only have as a treat. We practiced brushing our teeth and received our own toothbrush and toothpaste.

We are really enjoying being back in the playroom. The children are loving playing in the home corner again, looking after the babies and making 'tea' for all of us. It is lovely to have so much space again!

Next week is the final week of our Peter Pan inspired topic. We will be focusing on outdoor learning with the adventures of the Lost Boys. ***Could you please ensure your children have suitable clothing and wellies next week?***

Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe

It's been quite an adventure in Year 1 this week. We had our trip to the zoo on Tuesday, where we saw some beautiful animals. More info on page 9 of the newsletter.

In Maths we are comparing values using the vocabulary: more than, less than and equals.

In English, we are looking at the conjunction 'and', and how it can be used to join two related sentences, phrases and words together.

In our Geography topic 'The UK' this week, we looked at Northern Ireland. The children were very interested in the Giants Causeway and how it was formed. We learnt about the legend of Finn Mac-Cool and his feud with the Scottish giant Benandonner. I think the children preferred this version rather than the volcano! Also, the children had a good go at Irish dancing but found that it was very tiring on the legs.

In Art this week we are making turtle sculptures out of recycled materials using the sculptor Michelle Reader as our inspiration.



Year 2—Miss Jones

Year 2 have had another busy week. We have successfully completed our Little Red Riding Hood independent write in English. I have been really impressed with the children's hard work with their handwriting and responding to feedback, which is reflected in their writing.

We have finished our learning about multiplication and division in Maths. We spent this week dividing by 2, 5 and 10 before investigating odd and even numbers. It's been great to see us making links between the operations and exemplifying this in our verbal and written explanations.

The children enjoyed investigating a range of materials in Science to see whether they could change their shape. We had a great discussion with thoughtful responses as we realised that some materials can go back to their original state on their own like a sponge, however some don't. We were able to refer to the properties of materials to conclude which materials were easy and difficult to change the shape of.



On Thursday we completed our final piece in our Art sequence of learning based on Henri Matisse's collages. We enjoyed replicating his style and producing one of our own by using our knowledge of layering materials to produce a composition.

Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed our computing focus this term called 'Making Music' using the website Chrome Music Lab! **Can you have a go at making your own piece of music at home?** Have a lovely weekend all.

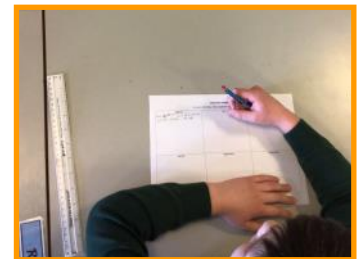
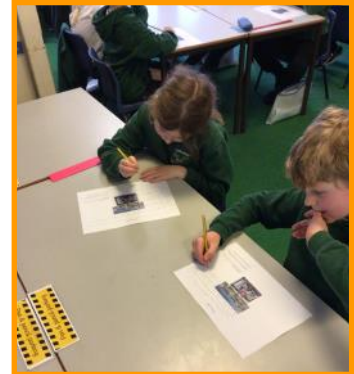
Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have been working hard this week! We have learnt about adding and subtracting money in maths and using this to find change. We have just started our new statistics sequence which will take us up to half term.

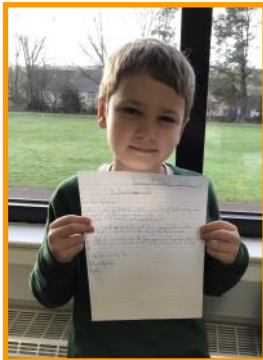
In English, we have looked at persuasive language and practised writing our own persuasive paragraphs. We have labelled a letter and learnt about the conventions of letter writing. Next week, we will complete our planning and independent writing.

In science, we thought about all things magnetic! We discovered how many real-life uses there are for magnets, from toys to MRI scanners. We have also discussed how London has changed over time due to events that we have already learnt about such as the Great Fire of London, in geography. We wrote sentences to compare London with Devon and thought about similarities and differences.

It is fantastic to see so much reading at home still, if the children are reading independently, they can write in their reading record book themselves. Don't forget, the children also all have a Read Theory login that they can use. Have a super week and see you all on Monday!



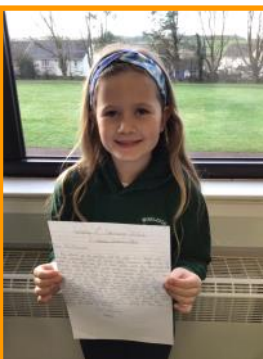
Year 4—Miss McLean



Year 4 have had another fantastic week. On Tuesday, it was Internet safety day so in computing this week we discussed how to stay safe online. The theme this year is relationships online so we looked at who we might build relationships with online when we are playing games.

In Science, we learnt where mains electricity comes from and what dangers of using it are. We then looked at a few dangerous scenarios and explained what we could do to make them safer.

We looked at the natural resource of water in Geography this week. We worked out how many times we rely on access to a supply of clean water in a single day and realised that we might be able to cut down the amount of water we use so that it doesn't go to waste. We then used all of these ideas to write a letter explaining what we can do to stop water being wasted at home and in school.



Finally, our spelling lessons this week have focused on using apostrophes and noticing when they are to show possession or contractions. ***Can you remember the difference between them?***

Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have really applied flexibility throughout their learning this week. In English, it has been enjoyable for use to look at a text with no words and infer meanings through illustrations. We have been working as detectives and journalists to recount information, in pairs we have used our questioning of a character in role play to conduct and write a formal report.

In Maths, we have been adding fractions together. We have used written, pictorial and concrete resources to help us find a common denominator to convert our fractions appropriately to find our answer. Once more we have focussed on the verbal discussion of using their prior knowledge of multiples to respond with 'I know that because...'

This week in Science we focussed on the works of key naturalists David Attenborough and Jane Goodall, researching and expressing their key findings around evolution. Additionally, we discussed the legacy these naturalists have brought and the role of Greta Thunberg in extending that further. Finally, we were able to merge together with Year 6 once more to start planning some exciting events in the summer term. Have a great weekend everyone!



Year 6—Mr Davis

Dear all, yet another busy week in Year 6 this week. In English, the children have been learning how to use adverbials and parenthesis to provide their reader with more information. They have been applying this by planning and creating a page for our fictional class reference book - The Glossary of Magical Objects. The results have been absolutely fantastic.

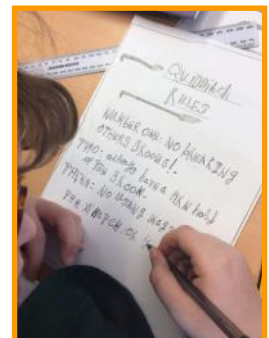
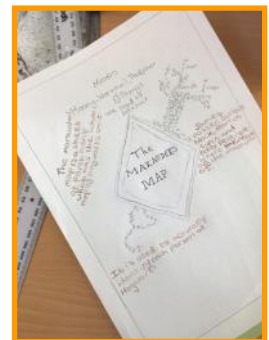
In Maths, we have been moving towards the end of our current sequence on fractions, decimals and percentages. The children have been learning how to manipulate fractions in order to compare them accurately. This has been a concept that the children have had to work very hard on and I have been very pleased with their application and efforts this week - well done.

In Art, the children have been planning their final piece of screen printing and perfecting their mark making techniques.

Science this week revolved around vertebrates and invertebrates and whether or not this is an effective method of classification. We then learnt how to precisely differentiate between the different types of animals - and looked for any species that did not fit into our classification systems.

In ICT this week, Year 6 have lent a hand to Mrs Singer by carrying out a series of tests on the new website that is being developed and providing (constructive) feedback.

Finally, on Wednesday, Year 6 joined forces with Year 5 to start planning an enormous joint project for the Summer term. You can all expect to hear about this in more detail soon. I hope you all have a wonderful weekend.

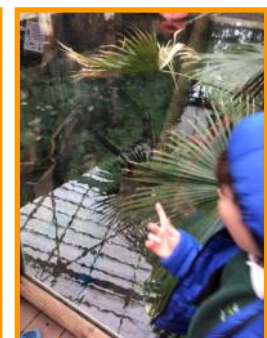
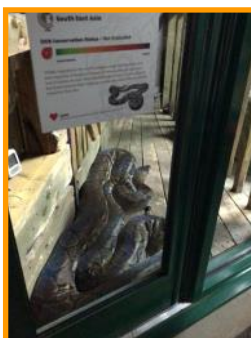
EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO PAIGNTON ZOO
