Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Nursery (Squirrels & Hedgehogs)—Mrs Stapley

This week has been spidertastic! We have based our learning around the nursery rhyme 'Incy Wincy Spider'. The children have been singing the rhyme and adding their own ideas for a new version! We have been weaving our own webs using wool, used tongs to collect the bugs from the spiders web and made our own giant spiders using the play dough and clay which included using our careful counting to add the hairy legs! In the garden we went on a spider hunt-looking high and low for the hidden spiders. Over the next couple of weeks we will be singing our favourite nursery rhymes. Perhaps over the weekend ask the children if they can sing their favourite song at home and we can share these songs in the nursery next week. 







#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

#### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

A short but busy week for Year One! In English we have continued with our sequence on Oi Frog! We had a go at drawing a story map and we are beginning to think of our own animal characters and rhyming items that they might eat! *Can you tell someone at home which animals you have chosen for your story?* 

In Maths we are continuing with place value and have been focusing on comparing objects and numbers. We have introduced the symbols <> and =. Can you explain what each of the symbols means?

In Geography we have been thinking about our journey to school and the things that we see when walking or driving. We considered whether these things are natural or human landmarks. *Can you talk about your journey to school? What do you see on your way?* In PHSE we have been thinking about feelings and who we can talk to if we are feeling sad or worried about something.

Next Friday (30<sup>th</sup>) we will be having our cake stall after school, please support our class by sending in some baked goods for us to sell!









#### Year 2—Miss Jones

This week in English we have started our new learning sequence based on the story Augustus and his smile. We responded to the text verbally and in sentences and stepped out the story by making a story map as a class.

In Maths we finished our learning on number lines and moved on to comparing objects and numbers by using the key vocabulary more than, less than and equal. We will explore counting next week before assessing our knowledge and understanding of place value over the last few weeks.

In Science we took our learning outside and explored our local woodland habitat. We worked as a team to Identify living things and describe the different conditions with adjectives.

On Thursday we sketched some shells, applying some of the mark making techniques learned last week. Have a good weekend and keep up the reading!

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have been busy again despite only having a four day week! We have continued our learning about speech, word classes and prepositions in English this week. I have been impressed with how well the children have got to grips with writing direct speech using inverted commas. This is always a tricky skill to learn.

We have finished our place value sequence in maths, concentrating on ordering and comparing numbers to 1000 this week. We will be beginning our addition and subtraction unit next week.

In science, we have learnt about the fossilisation process and drawn and labelled diagrams to show this. We will continue with our geography sequence next week, learning more about the structure of a volcano. The children have put their writing skills into practise this week by re-telling the creation story.

It has been great to see so many people logging onto Timestable Rockstars and giving the challenges a go! Keep it up, alongside all the fantastic reading at home! Have a super weekend and see you all on Monday!





#### Year 4—Miss McLean

Another busy week has passed in Year Four and it was so lovely to finish it off with the children being able to share their geography, science and history folders with you! They are so proud of the work they have worked hard to produce and they thoroughly enjoyed being able to show it off.

In maths this week, we focused on comparing and ordering numbers to 10,000. This morning, we started learning about roman numerals and learnt a song to help us remember them. In English, we continued learning about the Great Kapok tree and look at the key words *dilemma* and *resolution*. **Can you remember what these words mean?**We learnt about where rainforests are found in the world in geography and that the tropical rainforests are located between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn. In science, we discussed the key question **if sand can be poured, is it a liquid?** We had some great discussion around this question in our table teams. Have a fantastic weekend!

#### Year 5—Mr Walter

I can't quite believe it has been three weeks of term already.

Year 5 have really settled into our sequence of Rudyard Kipling and are enjoying delving into characters further, while focussing on how to format direct speech effectively. In maths, we have continued to represent numbers up to one million in many different ways. Creating puzzles and number lines to help represent the powers of 10.

In PHSE, the focus has been on the ability to understand other peoples opinions, working on strategies of how to listen and react in ranging situations.

Finally, we have been entered into a tournament for Times Table Rockstars starting at 3pm on Monday till 3pm Friday. This is a great opportunity to practice and develop our understanding.

#### Year 6—Mr Davis

We have a short but very eventful week in Year 6. In English, we have continued our sequence around the book Freedom Bird. The children have been writing in different roles and really thinking about the experiences of the characters in the story. They have also learned about figurative writing (such as metaphors) and how this concept can be used to enhance the meaning of their writing. The results have been fantastic - so well done to them all.

In maths, we have finished our first sequence on place value by looking at powers of ten, negative numbers and rounding.

In Geography, Year 6 have explored the reasons that maps often use a grid system so that objects can be located on them. They have practised using both four and six figure grid references.

In RE, the children have learned about Judeo-Christian deities and what characteristics they feel are important. In ICT this week, the children continued to learn about the features of spreadsheet software and how they can use them to perform increasingly complex calculations and solve real world problems.

I would like to say a huge thank you to everyone who came to our open morning on Friday. It was lovely to be able to invite you in. I hope you all have a lovely weekend.
