Our focus for Maths has been 'patterns' and the children have had fun looking for, and making repeating patterns with shapes, natural objects and also paint! They have made linear patterns and patterns that go round in a circle with no obvious start or finish, and have also made patterns with sounds and their bodies. As part of our phonics work the children have been looking for digraphs, trigraphs and double letters within words as well as looking at the different sounds made by some letters. What great writers some of the children are becoming, using their phonics skills too. Well done Owls, keep up your hard work.

As part of our work on traditional tales, the children thoroughly enjoyed making their own gingerbread characters this week and were very pleased that they got to eat their gingerbread men, women, chicks and Easter rabbits before they hotfooted it out of the oven! Year 1—Mrs Betts & Mrs Rowcliffe

We've had an incredible last week of term! The children have worked super hard. They've used their measurement knowledge and skills to bake and make this week. First they were making Easter Nests and thinking about why we celebrate Easter. Then, we were thinking about Thomas Farriner (The Great Fire of London) and his important job of being baker to the King of England, so we had a go at baking and made bread rolls. I hope they were delicious to eat, as they smelled so yummy!

We've also had various maths challenges throughout the week involving measurement, place value and addition and subtraction. We have come to the end of our English unit and are now creating our own poem based on the Train Ride. Earlier in the week we took a journey around the school and stopped to look at things on the way. We have used photos to sequence our journey and these are helping us to create our poetry. In History we explored the Great Fire of Crediton in 1743 and talked about the similarities and differences between that and the Great Fire of London.



It's lovely to see so many of you now logging on to the e-book system to access the reading books. This will help enormously to embed all the fantastic work that they've been doing in class with their phonics. We are so proud of the progress that Year 1 are making in phonics, so please keep supporting them to be fluent and successful readers.

Year 2—Miss Jones

We have made it to the end of term and it's been a very busy week!

We have loved learning about our focus story The Dragon Machine in English. Great predictions were made and the children responded to the text in the form of likes, dislikes, patterns and puzzles. Year 3—Mr Slocombe



I can't quite believe it is the end of term! It has certainly been a busy one in Year 3 and this week has been no exception!

We have drawn to the close of most of our sequences, completing our final assessment tasks and showing how much fantastic knowledge we have!

In History, we have discussed the changes and innovations during the Stone, Bronze and Iron age. We have drawn all of our learning form Year 3 and Key Stage 1 together in science and discussed that different animals have varying diets. We have shown our knowledge of healthy eating, as well as the role of key organs in the body.



We wrote instructions for making our hats in D&T and discussed how we could care for our learning environments in PSHE.

In RE, we considered different festivals that we knew about from Christianity, Islam and Judaism and made comparisons between them. We have completed our teaching sequence in writing, with the children writing their interview with an animal of their choice.



In Maths, we have found fractions of amounts, shapes and objects, and counted in fractions on number lines. We will be continuing with this unit after Easter.
