#### Dear Parents and Carers,

#### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

This week in Owls Class the children have continued to amaze and impress us with their learning and their resilience. In phonics, the children are now beginning to use their skills to write simple words, and are forming their letters beautifully using our formation phrases. They have enjoyed practising writing letters in glittery shaving foam this week! Next week is our assessment week in phonics so there will be no new sounds learnt, just a re-cap of all the ones learnt so far this half term.

In maths, 'Dear Zoo' has been our focus text and the children have enjoyed looking at the different sizes and weights of the animals from the story. They had fun comparing the sizes of different boxes and were surprised to learn that a bigger item is not always a heavy item. *I wonder if you can compare the weight of different items at home this weekend. Can you find something little that is really heavy? Or something big that is really light?* 

We had a lovely walk into the village on Tuesday to look at all the different features found in a Christian Church. The children enjoyed spotting the items we have been learning about in class and had some wonderful questions for Rev Helen Blaine. Our focus in PSED this week has been 'our feelings.' *For our show and tell session on Thursday next week, we would love it if the children could bring in a toy, a game or a photo of something that makes them feel happy.*

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

We continued with our English sequence this week, writing about our school signage and what it means. We are going to use our knowledge of Winkleigh to create an information page next week – explaining what a visitor to Winkleigh could expect to see and do here. In Maths we have been working on addition, number bonds to 10 and systematic number bonds. We have enjoyed some practical activities, manipulating counters into groups and recording addition number sentences.

In RE we have been discussing forgiveness and created 'forgiving fingers' to help us think about how we forgive people when they have made a mistake.

In Science we loved seeing how our beans have grown in the different growing conditions. We created a map of Winkleigh in our Geography lesson, each drawing a building within the village and then having a go at placing them in roughly the right places!



#### Year 2—Miss Jones

Another week has come and gone, I can't believe it is nearly half term! The children have worked hard this week to complete the independent writing in English. They have done so well and have really developed their writing stamina. Well done everyone!

We will be moving on to explore a non-fiction book next called penguins. We will build on our learning in Science and Geography to structure a factual piece of writing. In Maths we are exploring different methods to calculate addition and subtraction problems. At the end of the week we were introduced to column method alongside a pictorial representation.

Tuesday was definitely a highlight of the week as we visited Northam Burrows with Class 1 from Kings Nympton linking to our learning about habitats. We explored coastal habitats first hand and learned about the animals and plants that live there. Keep reading to see some pictures of our visit.

Lots of the children have been interested in the development of the houses across the school, especially the vehicles hard at work which they enjoy watching during lunch times. We are fortunate to be invited to the show home opening on Monday.

We also had our cake sale which was a great success, thank you everyone for support as the money raised will go towards our future trips. What a week!

#### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had another great week! I can't believe we are nearly at the end of our first half term! We have continued our learning around the book 'Gregory Cool' in English. The children have learnt about co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions and how they join various clauses together. Next week, we are planning and writing our own narratives based on the story.

We have learnt how to add and subtract numbers using column method this week. We have focused on adding two 3-digit numbers together where an exchange is required. It's great to see that the children are continuing to develop their times tables using TTRS.

In science, we have learnt about how compost is made and what we can put into it. During our geography lesson this week, we learnt about Earthquakes and the effects that they can have on an area.

Art saw us evaluate our collagraphs that we made and suggest things that went well and how we can improve them. It's fantastic to see the positive impact that reading at home has on the children's learning.

#### Year 4—Miss McLean







It's been another great week in Year Four this week!

In maths, we have spent lots of time learning to use the column method for subtracting including multiple exchanges. We also discussed how different methods of subtraction can sometimes be more efficient, such as number lines and counting on.

In English, we learnt and performed some poetry before having a go at creating some of our own versions of poems in the book.

In science, we started an experiment to find out what the best conditions for evaporation to take place. We are looking to find out the results on Monday next week!

In geography, we learnt about the threats to the rainforests including mining and farmers clearing land for growing crops and grazing cattle.

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

#### Year 5-Mr Walter

This week has been a little mountainous in Year 5. In Art with Miss Parsons, there were some excellent examples of collaged mountain models made through layering and placing objects to build their own landscape.

In English, we have started to explore a non-fiction text titled Great Adventurers, we have used this text to understand great expeditions and explorers from the viewpoint of Alastair Humphreys, while thinking of our own inspirations. In geography, we have started to design our own poster to explain the impact tourism has on mountain environments (both positive and negative).

In maths, we have used RUCSAC to create and answer our own word and multi-step problems. Finally, in science we have been able to explore the difference between melting and dissolving by carrying out experiments for different materials.

#### Year 6-Mr Davis

We are very lucky to be able to welcome Mr Robinson from Marjon University to join us in Year 6 until after Christmas. He has already settled into life at Winkleigh. In English this week, we have started s new sequence of learning centred on the classic tale - Beowulf. The children have listened to the whole tale, looked at the blueprint of the story and engaged with some of the wonderful rich language.

In Maths, we have continued to look at the four operations and have recapped the concepts and ideas we have studied to do with division in Key Stage 2. This is in preparation for long division starting next week. The children have all worked really hard.

In Science this week, the children conducted an experiment to find out what effect a light source has on a shadow. They conducted fair tests with a variable that they could control to generate their results.

In Geography, Year 6 have started their final project (planning an eco-settlement) by applying for fictional planning permission for their development. They really thought about the register of their letters and ensuring their language was precise.

Finally, in Art the children have started designing their final pieces of work based on the artists they have studied and the skills they have acquired.

- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less
