


Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

What a fantastic start to the term – Year One have settled in brilliantly and are adapting well to the Year One curriculum. We have enjoyed our English this week, focusing on the life of Dolly Parton as a significant individual. *Can you tell someone a fact about Dolly Parton?* In Maths we have been working with numbers to 10 and understanding the various ways in which the numbers can be represented. *Can you have a go at writing numbers to 10 in word form?* In Geography, we are beginning to learn about Winkleigh and our local area. We have begun thinking about what landmarks we can spot in and around the village. *Can you keep an eye out for landmarks on your journey to school?*









Year 2—Miss Jones

What a fantastic first week back in school! The children have settled in well and have learned the rules and expectations in class.

In Maths we have started our learning about place value. We have represented two-digit numbers with various resources as well as writing them in numerals and words. The children are developing their verbal reasoning and I have been very impressed with their number sentences and problem solving, well done everyone!

In English we are exploring the inspirational pilot, Amelia Earhart. The children have retained facts learned in Year 1 which has helped us to structure non-fiction writing. We are focusing on neat handwriting and developing our letter formation.



In Geography we started to learn about Antarctica. We completed an elicitation task to consolidate what we know about hot and cold places in the world. In Science our elicitation was about living things and their habitats. It's great to see us link back to what we already know.





The children should now all have reading books and message books. When you read at home with your child please log it in the reading record. We will check it in guided reading sessions. Have a great weekend everyone.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

What a fantastic first week back! Year 3 have settled really well into Key Stage 2 and are already working super hard, I have been so impressed! We began the week by learning and writing about Mary Anning. This linked to our English and science sequences and we were interested to learn lots of new facts about her.

In maths, we have started our sequence on place value and have spent time using different representations of numbers to understand their size. This has included part-whole models and dienes. We have started lots of our new units in the foundation subjects. In geography, we are learning about volcanoes and earthquakes during our extreme Earth topic!

We recalled and considered the creation story in RE and will be thinking about what Christians learn from the story. The children have also enjoyed their PE sessions with Mr Emery this week. Fantastic work Year 3 and I look forward to seeing lots of great reading at home next week!







Year 4—Miss McLean

We've had a wonderful first week together in Year Four this week! We spent some time getting to know the new structures and routines as well as starting our new learning sequences.

In English, we have spent the week looking at the book 'Fantastically great women who changed the world' and are looking forward to using our new knowledge to write some biographies from this learning next week. In maths, we have started our learning on place value by looking at some key vocabulary.

In geography, as part of our elicitation task we listened to the sounds of the rainforest before

drawing of what we imagined the rainforest is like. We also did elicitation tasks in PSHE, RE and music and are looking forward to starting these sequences next week.

Year 5—Mr Walter



It has been a fantastic to welcome everyone into Year 5 this week! Everyone has shown a real desire to engage with their learning and meet all learning tasks and challenges brilliantly.

In English, we have been starting to research our inspirational figures that played a key role in The Civil Rights Movement. This week in maths we have explored rounding and working with numbers up to 10,000 and reviewing our understanding of Roman numerals.

Across the foundation subjects, we have been busy showing our understanding through our elicitation tasks. Within the classroom, we have been able to integrate opportunities for excellent discussion around the vocabulary needed that links with our sequences.



I hope that everyone has received the spellings to be practiced at home to be checked next week, the day will be different as we are very much looking forward to going out of school on our first trip. A quick reminder about the trip next Wednesday - the children will all need **two** pairs of shoes, one of which they will be getting wet! Have a great weekend!



Year 6—Mr Davis

It has been so lovely to welcome the Year 6s back into school and settle them into the new routines of upper Key Stage 2. The children know that, as the oldest pupils in the school, they have a responsible to set a good example. In the mornings, Year 6 are already responsible for escorting the younger children to their classrooms and they have been particularly good with the new reception cohort.

In English this week, our first sequence has focussed on the differences and similarities between the American Civil Rights movement and the Black Lives Matter movement. I have been very impressed with the children's knowledge, interest and compassion around this subject.

In maths, Year 6 have started the first sequence on place value and are getting to grips with the expectations in the subject. We have also started our sequences in ICT, RE, Science and PSHE this week - so they have really hit the ground running! If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
