### Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

What a fantastic morning Owls had on Wednesday taking part in Sports Day. I am sure you will agree that they all did so well. What a great atmosphere there was with the children all cheering one another on, and what great sportsmanship they all showed their friends. We are so proud of them all. Well done Owls!

In other news; our butterflies had all hatched by Monday and were released into the wilds of the vegetable garden ready to begin their lifecycle once again!

On Tuesday we noticed that all of our superhero underpants had been stolen! The children set about searching for the villain but as yet they have not been found! Some very polite letters have been written in the hope that the mysterious aliens, monsters or dinosaurs will return the underpants soon!

In maths this week we have moved on to thinking about teen numbers and have been looking at the patterns past ten using Numicon and tens frames to compose numbers. As part of our RE work this week, the children listened to the Christian Creation story and worked together to sequence the story.

In PSED, they listened to a story called 'There's a house inside my mummy' and we talked about how we grow and change from babies, to very grown up schoolchildren. *We would love it if the children could bring in an item of clothing on Thursday that they wore when they were a baby or a toddler to link to our story 'You'll Soon Grow into it Titch.'*

### Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

We all thoroughly enjoyed Sports Day on Wednesday and the opportunity to put all our PE skills into practice.

In English this week we finished our own stories based on 'What Happens When...' We have started our sequence on instruction writing. We made toast with jam and then used that experience to form the basis of some simple instruction writing. We will be learning how to make slime next week and writing instructions for the process.

In Maths we have been learning about money. We have been recognising coins and notes. We have been understanding the value of each coin and have been using them to count. It is a good opportunity to apply our knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

In History we have learned about Grace Darling and the RNLI. We found the shipwreck rescue story fascinating and then painted our own portraits of Grace.

In Computing we are thoroughly enjoying Scratch Jr and learning how to use the programming blocks correctly. This week we found out how to add and delete sprites.

We discovered that each sprite has its own programming area,

and learned how to add programming blocks to give instructions to each of the sprites.

### Year 2-Miss Jones

Another busy week has flown by. In English we did our own shared write before planning our independent write explaining how to wash an animal of our choice. We worked on using interesting verbs and adverbs as well as writing with humour. In Maths we came to the end of our learning about statistics. We consolidated the ways that data can be represented and linked to problem solving contexts. In History we learned all about the differences with food and shopping during WWII. We examined different sources to learn about rationing and the fact that people's diets were much healthier because they were encouraged to grow their own fruits and vegetables. In Science we learned about another inventor called Charles Macintosh who invented waterproof coats. We learned a few facts about his early life before looking at the different experiments that he did to make fabric successfully waterproof. The highlight of the week was definitely sports day and everyone did brilliantly as they competed in their events. Have a good weekend everyone.

### Year 3—Mr Slocombe

Year 3 have had an excellent and very busy week! We have enjoyed learning about poetry in our new English sequence. We looked at a piece of artwork, creating our likes, dislikes, puzzles and patterns, before pulling them into a poem.

Maths has seen us continue our statistics sequence. We have collected data and used it to creat pictograms. In science, we have learnt about sun safety and the effects of the sun's UV light. History involved learning about Roman Ruins such as Hadrian's Wall.

Wednesday saw us compete enthusiastically in sports day, with the end of the week bringing our long-awaited camping residential!

### Year 4—Miss McLean

It's been an extremely busy week in Year Four this week including sports day on Wednesday. The children had a fantastic day and loved sharing it with their parents that came to support. It was great to see them all participating in every event and putting their all into it.

In English this week we have been using the Book of Bones to look at use of informal language through questioning as well as reminding ourselves of complex sentences and the difference between nouns and pronouns.

In maths we have been looking at bar charts, pictograms and line graphs and have use graph paper to have a go at representing different data. Next week we will move on to position and direction which will be our final sequence of the year.

In science, we have looked at the structure of teeth and what happens to them if they are not looked after properly. The children had plenty of ideas about how to look after their teeth and lots of questions about the possibilities when they are not looked after properly. We spoke about the importance of looking after teeth as they don't grow back again if they are damaged or decayed.

The children are all really looking to our residential to Escot next week, there has been lots of excitement and questions about it this week! Have a lovely weekend!

### Year 5—Mr Walter

This week in Year 5 we have been using similes and metaphors to write poems inspired by our text, The Tear Thief. In maths we have been learning how to convert between imperial and metric units of measure and had fun measuring objects around the classroom. For PSHE we created a peace tree together as a class and shared our ideas on how to make the world a more peaceful place. On Wednesday we had a fantastic time taking part in our sports day events and helping the year 6s complete their races too.









### Year 6-Mr Davis

Whilst it was nice to get back to 'normal' this week after our fantastic trip to London, we have had a very action-packed and busy five days! We started the week by learning about two French philosophers and how they interpreted the world. We have also started a short unit of work that centres on politics. The first session involved learning about the two main British political parties and how they differ in their policies and ideology. The children then took part in a debate about whether or not children should be 'fitted' with some sort of GPS tracker that they can have removed when they turn 18. It was a very lively debate.

In ICT, the children have been putting their video editing skills into practice by creating trailers and videos of the London residential and Sports Day for us to share with you. I am hoping that they can be published at the beginning of next week.

In PSHE, the children took part in their first RSE lesson and were very sensible and mature in their learning. I was also impressed with the questions that they asked and their confidence discussing the answers - so well done.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to the whole class for their efforts on Sports Day. Not only was I proud of their efforts as sports ambassadors and role models, but also to hear other members of staff praising their kindness, patience and their supportive natures was truly excellent. It really is a challenge to believe that their final sports day is over!

The children will be sent some lyrics to learn over the weekend and into next week as we start to prepare for their leavers' assembly which takes place at 2.00pm on the last day of term; Wednesday 19th July. Have a nice relaxing weekend!



Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
