Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

We have had great fun in Owls Class again this week, particularly on Tuesday with our sports day. It was so lovely to see so many parents there cheering the children on, and to watch the children's smiling faces as they ran, jumped and sprinted their way around the track. I think we may have some budding Wimbledon stars amongst us too after our PE lesson on Tuesday.

As part of our phonics and writing this week, the children have started writing their own books based on our class text 'The Flying Diggers.' They have really risen to the challenge and they are looking forward to sharing their stories with Year 2 once they have finished writing them.

In maths, the children have enjoyed investigating 'longer' and 'shorter' this week and also worked well to make repeating patterns using natural materials.

Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

Year One had a fantastic time on Tuesday at Sports Day. We came out to watch lots of the races and we learnt the importance of cheering everyone on to do their best – well done to everyone.

In English this week we have begun (with great excitement) 'The Slime Book'. We began the week by making jam sandwiches and then wrote our own instructions independently. We will soon be making our own slime and focusing on how to write a good set of instructions that someone else could follow. In Maths we have been learning about money and how to recognise different coins and notes. ***Can you have a look at some money at home and identify the coins and notes?***

In Computing we have been choosing appropriate backgrounds and sprites for a 'Space race' project. We decided how each sprite would move, and created an algorithm based on the blocks available in ScratchJr.

In Science this week we have been thinking about the vocabulary flexible and rigid. We have decided which materials fit into which category.

Our RE continues with Judaism. This week we learned the story about how Moses became part of the Egyptian royal family, after his mother became scared he might be killed. She hid him in a basket, on the Nile, for the Egyptian Princess to find.

In DT we have made our fruit salad. We tasted the fruit, designed the salad and finally have made the product—it tasted yummy!

Next week we have our two transition days and are looking forward to being in Year 2 with Miss Jones.



Year 2—Miss Jones

What a super week we have had. In English we have continued our poetry unit and have performed more poems from our focus book, 'I am the seed that grew the tree'. We also had a go at writing our own shape and colour poems, there are definitely some budding poets in this class who are bursting with creativity! In Maths we completed our time sequence ready to begin our last unit of mass, capacity and temperature. We will explore this topic practically next week. In History we looked at how shopping has changed from the past and what it is like in the present. We noticed that there were many similarities and differences!

In RE with Mrs Gent we learned about the legacy of mother Theresa. The highlight of the week was definitely on Tuesday when in was Sports Day. Everyone did fantastically and tried their best at every event. Well done everyone for your perseverance and resilience. Have a great weekend everyone.

History involved us thinking about the legacy of the Romans. We considered what they invented and created and how those innovations are still relevant and used in our daily lives. We have also created our Roman shields for our Roman experience day in a couple of weeks' time.

Year Four have had a brilliant week this week and thoroughly enjoyed getting involved on Sports Day! It was fantastic to see everyone's resilience and perseverance when taking part in all the sporting events.

Also we have been busy researching the interesting stories of Winkleigh Airfield, reading information of the secret spy missions that took place.

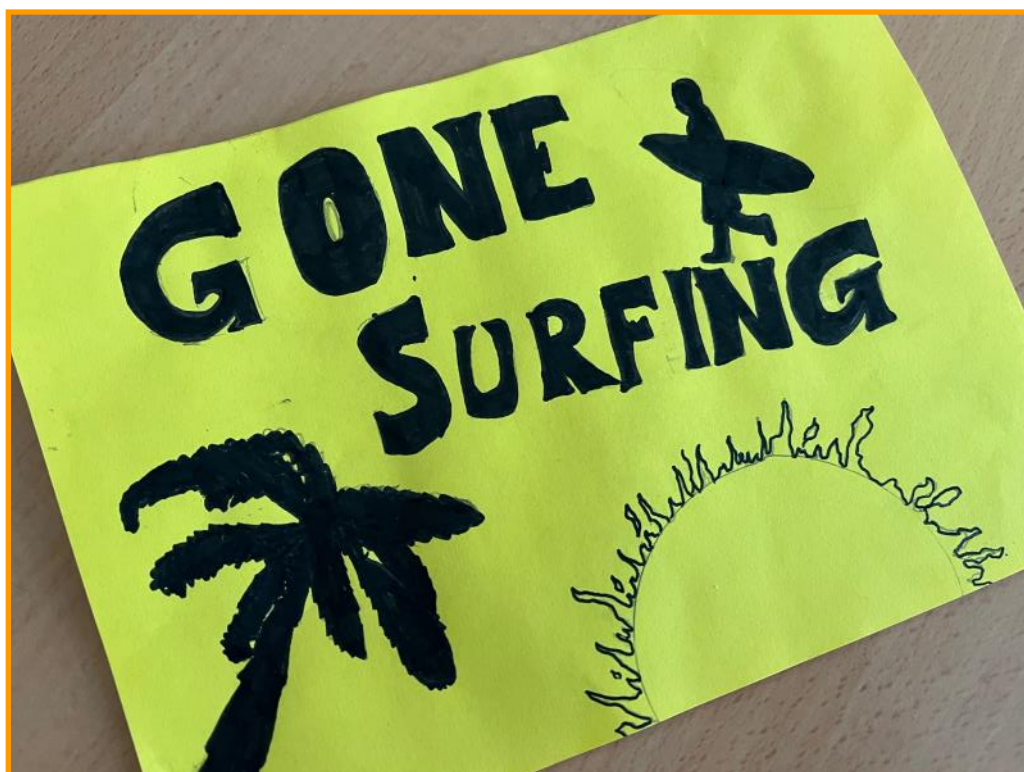

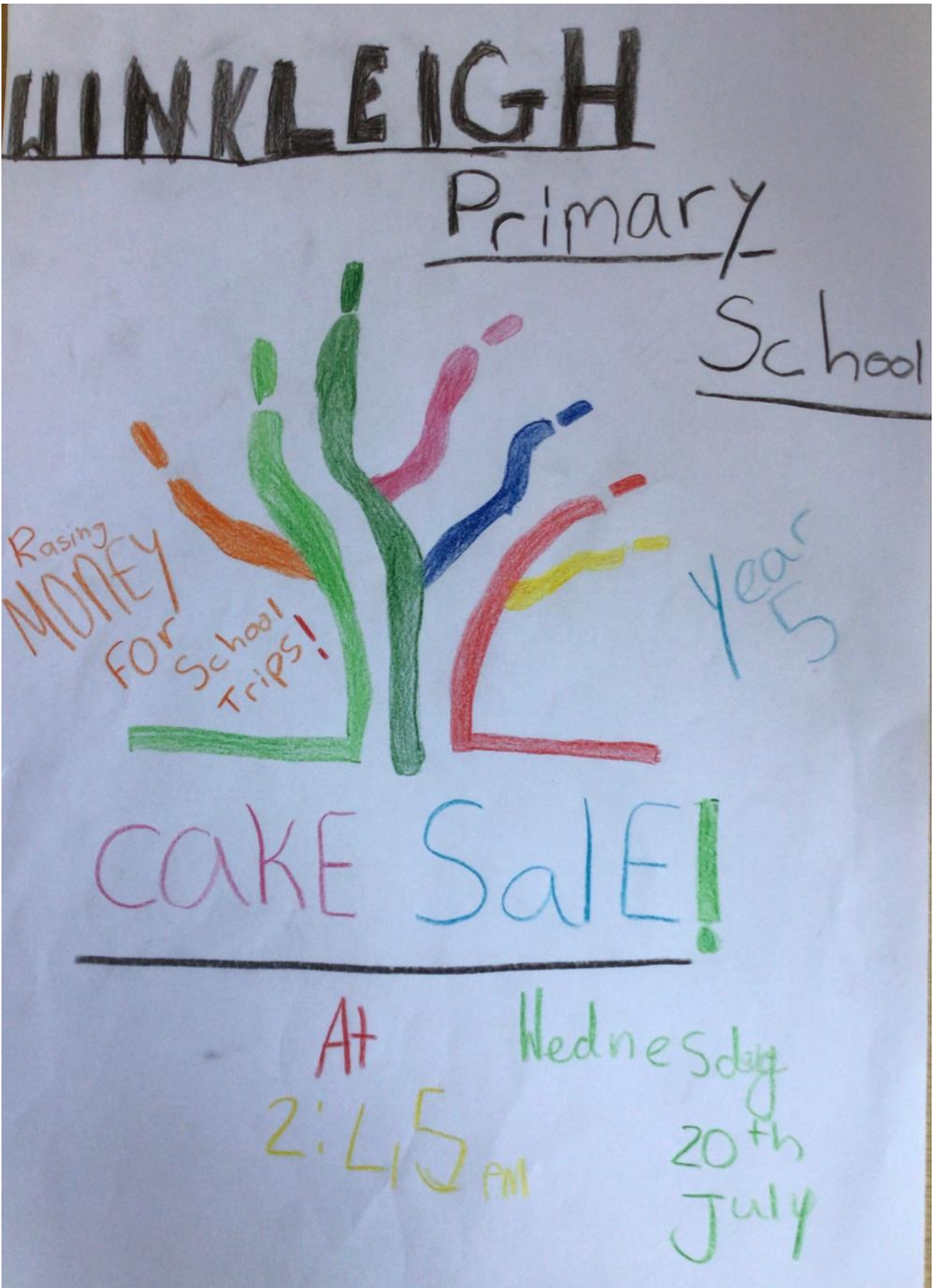
