Owls Class—Mrs Bourner

In Owls class this week the children have been thinking about the Hindu festival of Diwali. They have listened to stories about the festival, created rangoli patterns using paint, coloured sand and chalks and enjoyed icing biscuits with rangoli patterns for our 'Teddy Bears Picnic' on Thursday.

In P.E, the children have re-told the story of Diwali through dance. They have made clay divas and have also enjoyed dressing up and having their own parties and celebrations in our outside area.

In maths the children have looked at different ways to compose numbers and have enjoyed listening to different versions of 'The Three Bears' story.

We will begin practising for our Christmas Nativity next week and will be walking to the church in between the showers! *Please could you ensure your child has a waterproof coat with them next week.*

SHARING OUR LEARNING AND A MESSAGE FROM THE TEACHERS

Year 1—Mrs Rowcliffe & Mrs Keast

This week we have completed our learning in English based on 'A Dog's Day' and have created our own stories based on a trip to the supermarket. We had a go at writing one version of the story and retelling the same story orally from a different perspective. In Maths we have also been completing our unit of learning on addition and subtraction. We have had a go at answering some word problems this week.

In our History lesson we enjoyed thinking about our personal timelines and the toys we enjoyed playing with when we were younger. We talked about how the toys we enjoy now are very different.

In Computing we have created Mondrian inspired artwork using Paintz. We learned how to use the line and square drawing tools as well as the 'fill' tool to paint areas of colour.



Year 2-Miss Jones

The children thoroughly enjoyed the pantomime on Monday and it was a great start to our week! In English we have been exploring our new story called Father Christmas and the three bears. We learned key vocabulary before applying it in sentences. We also compared the story to the original fairytale and considered what was similar and different. Towards the end of the week we sequenced the events in the story. We have been working hard on our handwriting and letter formation, well done everyone.

In Maths we came to the end of our addition and subtraction learning. The children demonstrated resilience when tackling tricky exchanging questions, applying their knowledge of number and place value. After some arithmetic consolidation, we will move on to shape.

This week in guided reading we have been focusing on the skill of inferencing. As a class, we have explored different texts and practiced using our rulers to underline relevant parts to help us answer comprehension questions.

In Science we learned about desert habitats and focused on a camel and cactus. We considered how they are adapted to survive in their environment in our writing. In RE we performed 'In the beginning' which is a poem about the creation story in groups. Then on Thursday in DT we experimented with layering different parts to make an animal. We are all excited to design our own fridge magnets next week. Well done everyone, enjoy your weekend.

Year 3—Mr Slocombe

It's been another exciting week in Year 3! During English this week, we have finished our sequence based on 'Interview with a Tiger.' The children have written their own versions of the text, based on an animal of their choice. I have been really impressed with the children's focus on presentation and handwriting this week!

In maths, we have continued our multiplication and division unit, learning about multiplying and dividing by 3. We have also thought about multiples of 2, 5 and 10 and what they each have in common. We will be investigating friction next week in science, testing how far a car can travel on a range of surfaces.

History has seen us continue to consider the importance of the River Nile to the Ancient Egyptian civilisation and we have created extended pieces of writing. It is great to see reading at home continuing and the use of Times Tables Rockstars, well done everyone! We will soon be making our instruments in our D&T sequence and we are in need of recycled materials!

Year 4—Miss McLean



Year Four have been working extremely hard this week. In maths, we have been learning and practicing our times tables up to 12 x 12. It has been great to see so many of you logging on to Times Table Rock Stars for some extra practice at home!



In English, we have written our own Myth by following the structure of myths that we identified at the start of the week. We included as many of the ingredients of myths that we could along with adverbials and complex sentences. Next week, we will move on to planning and writing individual myths to make our own version of the book Myth Atlas.

On Thursday afternoon in D&T, we had a go at making a square frame. We used hack saws to cut the accurately measured pieces of wood to make a square shape.





Finally, in PSHE on Wednesday afternoon, we talked about the importance of respect. We discussed the importance of respecting people's differences and making everyone feel equal.

Year 5—Mr Walter

Year 5 have had a great week, it's started to feel a little Christmassy with the fantastic pantomime on Monday.

We have conducted a World Cup sweepstake in class with everyone having to create a fact file for their drawn country.

In maths, we have been exploring in greater depth the methods of multiplication and division with ranging numbers.

In English, we have finished our learning sequence of The Lost Words by creating our own poem that would fit into a sequel of the text. Additionally, we had some lovely drawings to go alongside their finished piece.

Year 5 & 6 have continued to work brilliantly together to come up with their Christmas fair ideas. Each group conducted a questionnaire to the other classes as consumer research.

Year 6-Mr Davis



The week started with a real treat this week - Year 6's last M&M pantomime performance of Cinderella. I know the children really enjoyed it.

In English, Year 6 have continued with their sequence on Northern Lights. They have been looking at how Phillip Pullman uses single and multi-clause sentences to build tension and cohesion in his writing. They have applied these skills by designing their own daemons and writing a passage of the story from Pantalaimon's perspective.



In Maths this week, the children have learnt how to manipulate simple and mixed fractions to make them easier to understand. They have then revised adding and subtracting simple fractions before moving onto adding mixed numbers and improper fractions.

In DT this week, the children have visited classrooms further down the school in order to test the questionnaires they designed last week. In their lesson, the Year 5 and 6 teams were split in half. One half worked with Mr Walter to analyse their results and plan their activity; the other half worked with Mr Davis to practise and refine their wood work skills.

In History, Year 6 have learned about the life and wives of King Henry VIII by researching and creating a family tree for this period of history. Finally,

in RE, the children have learnt about the Christian God's motivation for creating the world. They have considered His intentions and also questioned some of the things that exist in the world that may not have been intended. Have a lovely weekend.

Are you entitled?

Families with children in Key Stage 1 who are eligible are encouraged to apply as the funding is in addition to Universal Infant Free School Meals!

If your circumstances have changed and you are now in receipt of one or more of the following:

- Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)
- Income support
- Income-based jobseekers' allowance
- Income-related employment and support allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state pension credit
- Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

You may be eligible for pupil premium funding for Winkleigh Primary School, which entitles your child/ren to receive Free School Meals.
