PSHE at the Woodland Federation

At both of our schools, our mission is to create a superb learning community that challenges children to acquire a thirst for knowledge. Our intention is to ensure we deliver an enriching and meaningful Personal, Social and Health Education curriculum, (PSHE) which is accessible to all children, particularly those with SEND. Our schools have adopted the Coram Life Education programme to deliver our vision.

PSHE is central to all aspects of pupil learning in the Woodland Federation, both in the classroom and beyond. It is taught, both as timetabled weekly lessons and across the school day in every aspect of school life. Our curriculum takes a spiral approach, gradually revisiting topics at a deeper level in each year group and key stage, whilst rehearsing, emphasising and embedding the essential skills and attributes young people need to manage their lives, both now and in the future. Our framework for PSHE embeds Citizenship and Health Education, as well as Relationships and Sex Education.

At the Woodland Federation, we also pay close attention to the vocabulary required by a child to explain their thinking, to ask and answer questions and begin to express their views in response to what they are taught. This is in line with the Oracy project that we use across our curriculum.
