Prior Knowledge:

Year 3—You learned that different religions involve different beliefs, traditions and teachings. You also learned about the type of world that Jesus wanted and how his teachings steer Christians towards this.

Year 4— You learned about and discussed the Holy Trinity and what their symbolic meaning is in Christianity. You also learned about the end of Jesus' life and how this story is retold in the Bible.

Year 5— You learned about the Christian ideas of 'holy' and 'loving' and considered how they are taught in the Bible. You also considered the loving nature of the Judeo-Christian God when he allows the young and the innocent to suffer.

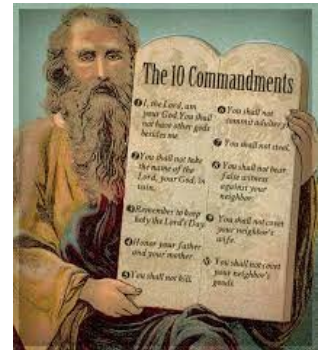
To engage with an consider some of the teachings from the Judeo-Christian Bible that exemplify the following qualities: holy, loving and being a saviour.
